Pastor's Corner

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

"They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body."

Luke 24:2-3

I wonder what would happen.

Famed psychologist Rollo May tells a wonderful story about a visit to Mt. Athos, a peninsula of monasteries attached to Greece. While there, he happened to stumble upon an all night celebration of Greek Orthodox Easter. Incense hung in the air. The only light came from candles. At the climax of the service, the priest gave each person three Easter Eggs, splendidly decorated and wrapped in a veil. "Christos Anesti," (Christ is Risen) the priest shouted. Each person

replied in Greek, "He is risen indeed!" In writing about the experience, May says, "I was seized then by a moment of spiritual reality: what would it mean for the world if He had truly been risen?"

I put that same question to you with just a slight alteration. What can it mean to our world that Christ is really risen? The question that the empty tomb asks of most of us is not whether Christ was risen, but what difference does it make to us, and through us, that he was.

The gift of the resurrection is first and foremost hope.

Because we have seen that no power on earth can stop the love of God for us, we can face whatever life brings, even death, knowing that we are more than conquerors through Christ. When we die and rise with Christ in our baptisms death is really, finally and utterly defeated for us, just as it was for him. It has no ultimate hold. It has no final say.

I wonder what would happen if, this year, we decided not to allow the alleluias to go silent when the eggs are eaten and the baskets filled with moose moss are put away for another year. I wonder what would happen if we decided this year, to rise each day with the simple declaration, "Christ is Risen!" I wonder what would happen if we whispered those words in our silent hearts as we brushed our teeth, or fixed our meals, or drove to work, or sat for a test in school. I wonder what would happen if we whispered "Christ is Risen" as we paid our bills, or saw a sunset, or faced a family or health crisis. I wonder what would happen if we whispered "Christ is Risen" as we planned our time and priorities, as we watched the evening news, as we faced the mystery of our own mortality, as we ponder what is worthy of our lives. I wonder what would happen if we whispered "Christ is Risen" by our actions in a broken and fearful world. This year, let's find out! Make this fundamental and mysterious statement of our faith your daily affirmation and let us see what the Lord will do! Christ is Risen! Christ is risen indeed!

East Sussex, 1914. It is the end of England's brief Edwardian summer, and everyone agrees that the weather has never been so beautiful. Hugh Grange, down from his medical studies, is visiting his Aunt Agatha, who lives with her husband in the small, idyllic coastal town of Rye. Agatha's husband works in the Foreign Office, and she is certain he will ensure that the recent saber rattling over the Balkans won't come to anything. And Agatha has more immediate concerns; she has just risked her carefully built reputation by pushing for the appointment of a woman to replace the Latin master.

When Beatrice Nash arrives with one trunk and several large crates of books, it is clear she is significantly more freethinking—and attractive—than anyone believes a Latin teacher should be. For her part, mourning the death of her beloved father, who has left her penniless, Beatrice simply wants to be left alone to pursue her teaching and writing.

But just as Beatrice comes alive to the beauty of the Sussex landscape and the colorful characters who populate Rye, the perfect summer is about to end. For despite Agatha's reassurances, the unimaginable is coming. Soon the limits of progress, and the old ways, will be tested as this small Sussex town and its inhabitants go to war.
