PASTORS CORNER

When I was a little girl, I often had a hard time breathing. I remember it being especially difficult in the spring when the thick pine pollen coated the front porch of our home, the cars in the drive and the lungs in the house.

Sometimes, when the air was thick and the infections in my lungs persistent, my mother would come and lie across the foot of my bed and tell me stories of Sea Grove Beach, Florida. Sea Grove was, in those days, a tiny barely developed spot on the Gulf coast where the waters were emerald green and warm and the sands sugar white. It always seemed that I breathed a little easier there. Maybe the ocean breezes swept the pollen far in land and away. I'm not sure. But I remember when I was sick that Mama laid at the foot of my bed and reminded me of Sea Grove. She promised that if I would hold on, we would

go there. I remember closing my eyes and breathing deeply, as deeply as I could, and imaging myself running along the shore in the sunshine with my eyes closed and arms outstretched. It was my vision of wholeness.

Every person, I think, has a picture in his or her mind's eye of what life should be like, or could be like, if everything were in perfect order.

Sometimes we live into those pictures. Sometimes we don't. If they are healthy and life giving, those pictures lead us even when we are having difficulties.

The same is true of churches. Many of us have a vision of what church is at its best. We don't all have the same vision, at least not in the details, but all of our visions for the church include some common elements. We know that when we are being our best we are loving, close, Christ-centered, Biblically grounded, poured out for the community, tolerant of others failings and generous in mind, spirit and resources.

May is a wonderful month for thinking again of who we really are and how we are most vitally healthy as a congregation. It is a great time to remind each other of where we are going and who we most truly are. So I encourage you this month to think and pray a little about the future for our church. When you close your eyes and stretch out your arms, what do you see? How do we start to get there? Let the wonder of what God may yet want to do with us wash over and inspire you. I'd love to hear what you think!

May 10: The Summer Before the War by Helen Simonson (Novel)

East Sussex, 1914. It is the end of England's brief Edwardian summer, and everyone agrees that the weather has never been so beautiful. Hugh Grange, down from his medical studies, is visiting his Aunt Agatha, who lives with her husband in the small, idyllic coastal town of Rye.

Agatha's husband works in the Foreign Office, and she is certain he will ensure that the recent saber rattling over the Balkans won't come to anything. And Agatha has more immediate concerns; she has just risked her carefully built reputation by pushing for the appointment of a woman to replace the Latin master.

When Beatrice Nash arrives with one trunk and several large crates of books, it is clear she is significantly

more freethinking—and attractive—than anyone believes a Latin teacher should be. For her part, mourning the death of her beloved father, who has left her penniless, Beatrice simply wants to be left alone to pursue her teaching and writing.

But just as Beatrice comes alive to the beauty of the Sussex landscape and the colorful characters who populate Rye, the perfect summer is about to end. For despite Agatha's reassurances, the unimaginable is coming. Soon the limits of progress, and the old ways, will be tested as this small Sussex town and its inhabitants go to war.

The 2018 Birthday Offering of Presbyterian Women

Continuing a mission of giving that began in 1922, our Presbyterian Women will sponsor this year's Birthday Offering on Mother's Day, May 13th. The name "Birthday Offering" comes from the story of Hallie Paxson Winsborough challenging her Presbyterian Women's group to give one penny for each year of their lives as a birthday gift to a school for girls in Kochi, Japan.

Since that time, the Birthday
Offering has become an annual
tradition. Monetary gifts have
funded nearly 100 major mission
projects to assist women and
children both here in the USA and
around the world. Birthday
Offering grants primarily fund
capital improvement projects.
Because these are large projects,
only a small number are chosen
each year.

In 2018, we will offer our prayers and financial support for the following:

Cottage Village, a Tiny-house Community for Low-Income

Residents – Cottage Grove, Oregon

Our birthday offering grant will be used to help build 13 tiny houses and community center that will serve as a compassionate and protective community for vulnerable rural citizens.

Village of Grace Center for Physical and Spiritual Health – Tegucigalpa, Honduras

Our birthday offering grant will purchase the Village of Grace Center (originally established by Presbyterian mission workers) to function as a retreat center, managed by the Presbyterian women of Honduras. It will offer international hospitality for retreats, workshops, and mission teams from the PC (USA), Solar Under the Sun, and Waters for the World.

The Dwelling Place – Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minnesota

The Dwelling Place was established in 1998 to provide for the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of women and their children following their escape from a violent partner. The Birthday Offering Grant will help purchase a vacant lot which will be used to build a multipurpose building, allowing expansion of their program helping more women and children who are seeking safety.





Youth Fundraiser * Education Room Tours Sunday, May 6
