How Do I...

Once you've decided to trace your family's history, you should define your genealogical goals. Are you searching for knowledge of four generations, that fit on one pedigree chart? Are you searching for knowledge of a particular ancestor, such as your great-great grandfather? Are you seeking to prove a family tradition? Or, are you interested in finding your family's origins? If your ultimate goal is to research more than one genealogical line, build a foundation of four generations, then extend each line further back as you find more information.

The next step is to gather and sort the genealogical materials around you. Search garages, attics, basements, the closet, under the bed or anywhere else that genealogical material may be hidden away. About now, you may be wondering just what are "genealogical materials". Genealogical materials are items that contain information on your family. Places to look are albums, pictures, Bible records, birth announcements, histories, legal documents (wills, deeds, etc.); marriage announcements, newspaper clippings, pictures, souvenirs, certificates (all kinds), diaries, journals, fraternal awards, letters, memorial cards, obituaries, occupational records, school records, scrapbooks, mementos and various other family treasures. You may be surprised at what you can find. Ask other family members to search their collections, too!

With all of this heaped around you, don't feel too overwhelmed. Take a deep breath and start sorting your materials. Sort the gathered material into four groups: (1) yourself, (2) your father's line (paternal), (3) your mother's line (maternal), and (4) miscellaneous. Miscellaneous items are those that contain information on one or more lines combined, general information, and anything unclassified or that you don't know what to do with (yet).

With the four neat and tidy (!) piles around you, arrange each pile in chronological order, as best you can. Then make a list of everything within each category, so you will have a quick and ready reference to what information you already have on hand. Add to the list as you gather more information.

After the organizing is complete, sit down and begin your personal history. To do this, write down the major highlights and events and learning experiences of your life. This will provide you with an idea of the types of records and items you need to look for, and it also will give your family a view of what you were like as a child, young adult, etc.

Be sure to contact as many other family members as possible and let them know what you are doing. Ask them if they have any information on the family, or know someone who does. It may take a while to get responses to your inquiries, so be patient! You may find someone else who is interested in family history with whom you can exchange information.

This should be enough to get you started on the wonderful journey of tracing your family history back through time. Some bits of advice to remember--(1) be patient! and (2) be organized! (3) become a member of a genealogical society! You will gain valuable help and support from others interested in the pursuit of GENEALOGY. Good luck and happy hunting!

BOOK REVIEWS by Art Kelly

These new books are available for public use in the genealogical section of the Toledo Public Library:

LINCOLN COUNTY, OREGON, 1900 CENSUS INDEX: Compiled by the Oregon Genealogical Society, Inc., 1984. This 19-page index is a complete name index to the census, including head of household, spouse, children, etc. Also includes an 8-page index for the Indian Population Schedule for Lincoln County, Oregon. (YGS library).

THE LIBRARY: A GUIDE TO THE L. D. S. FAMILY HISTORY LIBRARY: Edited by Johni Cerny and Wendy Elliott, 1988. This book provides a detailed description of the major resource collections available at the Family History Library of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Salt Lake City, UT. The Family History Library's holdings include something for nearly every country in the world--including gazetteers, histories, guides to archival and library materials in the country itself, and some family histories and genealogies. (Public library).

UNITED STATES CENSUS KEY: 1850, 1860, 1870: Compiled by Col. Leonard H. Smith, Jr., 1987. This volume indexes the contents of the microfilm rolls of the United States Federal Population Censuses of 1850, 1860, and 1870, including the microfilm roll numbers for both the National Archives and the L. D. S. Church library. Each county is identified and shows the names of towns or enumeration districts on each roll. (Public Library).

A HISTORY OF THE DESCHUTES COUNTRY IN OREGON: By the Deschutes County Historical Society, Bend, OR, 1985. 530 pages. Profiles the biographical history of Deschutes area families, special districts, associations, organizations, towns/communities, churches, schools, clubs, hospitals, governmental bodies, industries, etc. Includes the 1900 Deschutes County Census. (YGS Library).

GOOD NEWS!! Librarian Blythe Jorgensen attended our September meeting and informed us that there are possible grant funds available from the State which would purchase a microfilm reader/printer! YGS members were urged to write letters attesting to the need for such a machine in this area, which were turned in by the October 3rd deadline along with the grant application. Many thanks to everyone who took the time to write the support letters. Now let's keep our fingers crossed and hope that the library will receive a grant for this worthy purpose.

The new Vital Records Handbook purchased by the YGS has arrived and will be available shortly on the library shelf. (Look for a bright yellow cover). It has copies of order forms for vital records for each state and Canadian province, plus current prices for the record copies. PLEASE, PLEASE--when you use this book, DO NOT tear out the forms from the book! Use photocopies so that everyone can have the information they need in the future.

The Toledo Library is hosting a writer's residency workshop November 29, 30 and December 1. Two authors will be visiting and working with high school and middle school students, plus interested adults. There will be both day and evening sessions, and the authors will be knowledgeable about helping us write our family histories. Best of all, the program will be FREE to users, funded by the Oregon Committee for the Humanities. Watch for more details in the local newspapers.

September was Genealogy Month for Oregon--so designated by Governor Goldschmidt, at the request of the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society, Inc., at Medford.

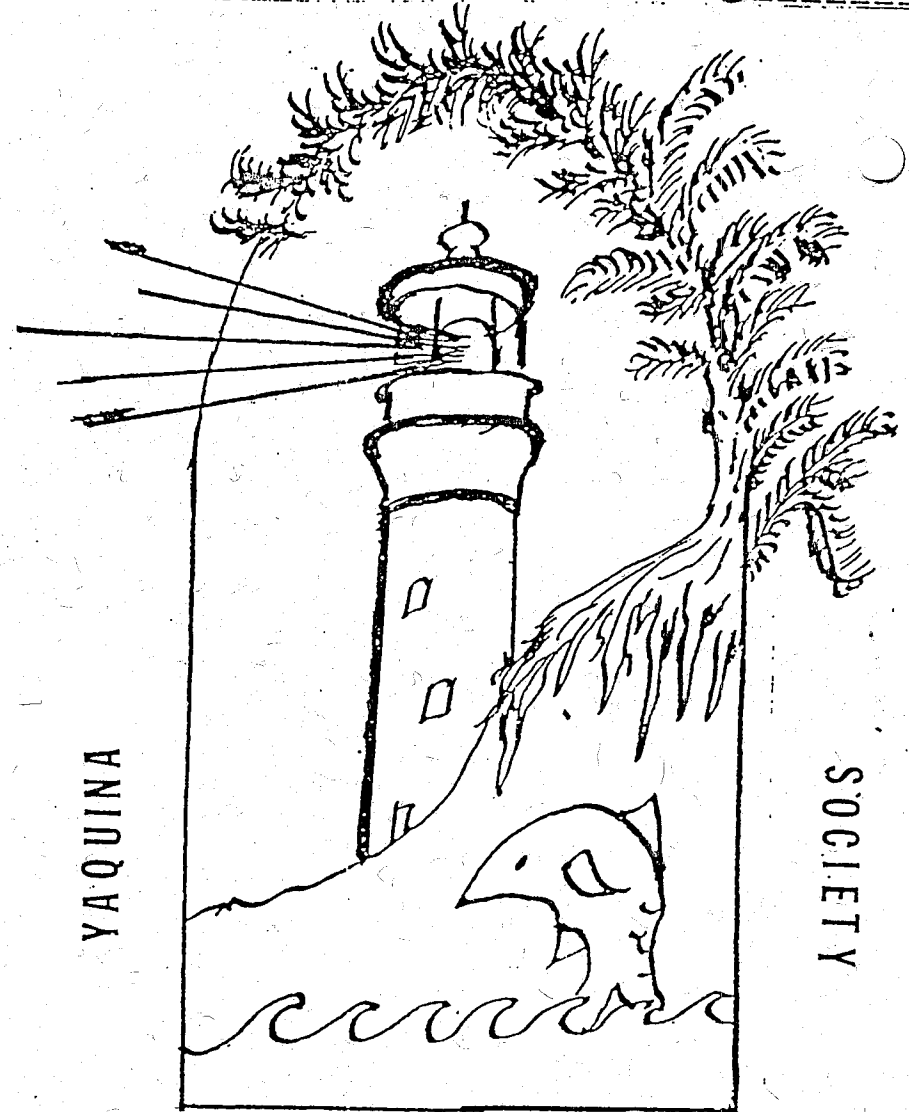

On September 7th, KATU Channel 2 TV did a feature story on Lincoln County author-historian-genealogist and friend-of-the-YGS, Evelyn Parry, and her work in recording inscriptions from stones in many cemeteries in the county area.
