Tips for Learning New Words

NAME GAME

Play simple naming games with your child. You can ask, "What is this?" or "Where is he or she going?" when you go to the grocery store, go on a walk, or sit and look out the window.

EVERYDAY WORDS

Talk to your child as you do everyday tasks such as sorting the laundry, for example, "Here are the dark clothes and here are the white clothes." Show your child the ingredients you have for making a meal and name them together.

READ

Read and reread books about topics your child is interested in. Learn names of animals, vehicles, plants, and games together.

FIELD TRIPS

Take your child on short trips to new places, such as a florist shop or a park. Talk about what you see along the way and what you see when you get there. When you get home, have your child draw a picture of something he or she saw. Write a caption for the picture.

JOB TALK

Go to a familiar place and look for the people who work there. What jobs do they do? What tools do they use?
