How to Find a Pantry in your Neighborhood

- Use this guide to look for the pantry most convenient to you, or look up a map of pantries on our website.
- For most pantries, you don't need to live in a certain city or neighborhood. A few of our partners prefer to serve individuals living closest to them, but even if you live outside their service district, they will provide you with food that day and help you find another pantry.

What do you need to bring?

• You don't need to bring anything to a pantry but yourself. You do not need to bring any proof of identification or income to a pantry.

What can you expect when you get there?

- Each pantry is unique, but all operate on the same basic principles. You'll arrive, go through a brief intake procedure that involves writing down your name and your address (if you don't have an address, that's ok!) and agreeing that you meet the federal income guidelines (see back of this booklet).
- Some pantries distribute pre-made food boxes, but most offer a shopping style experience where you can choose the items that you want. You'll get enough food to last about three to five days (depending on your household size) and be able to choose from a mix of fresh produce, bakery, dairy, protein, and shelf stable products—although there's never any guarantee about exactly what kind of food is available.
- Most pantries are run by volunteers who are doing their best to make sure their neighbors have access to the food we all need.

What can you expect when you visit a community meal?



Every meal site is unique, but all of them operate on the same basic principles. Whatever meal you attend, you should feel welcome and safe. Usually you will be greeted upon arrival, go through a buffet style meal line, and gather at tables with other guests. Some meals might be more focused on serving certain populations—like individuals experiencing homelessness—but all of them are intended to provide access to food for people who face barriers to getting healthy, nutritious meals. Just like at a pantry, you do not need to bring any form of ID or proof of your income, address, or citizenship, and you will not be compelled to participate in any religious activity in order to receive food. Hopefully, you'll have the opportunity to meet new neighbors, or even become a regular attendee and find a new community.






