

Pastoral Notes

We have a **Liturgy Workshop** (Liturgy 101) on November 2, Saturday, 2pm and November 8, Friday, 6pm. All sessions will be the Parish Hall. Every Liturgical Minister or anyone interested to volunteer in one of our liturgical ministries is welcome to attend one of the two same presentations. There will be discussions on the draft protocols for the various ministries.

Mark your calendars... Advent Reflection Evenings on December 2-4 (Monday to Wednesday), 7pm. Fr Edmund will reflect of the following themes: Advent according to Mary (December 2), Advent according to Joseph (December 3) & Advent according to the Church (December 4). A "parish" hall meeting follows each of the sessions with coffee, goodies and "miked" conversations.

A **Program of Activities** (December 2019 to November 2020), will be published next month. All ministries and organizations are asked to submit their respective lists of activities, including regular meetings, workshops and socials and if applicable, their respective budgetary requirements, by October 31. This will help us schedule our parish events in advance to avoid double bookings, conflict of schedules and to accommodate diocesan and other parish-affiliated groups to book our facilities.

Last weekend, we had a break-in attempt using pliers to destroy the lock in the North Door entrance. Due to our security enhancements on our external doors (\$6600) and the re-keying of the entire facility (\$7800), the attempt was unsuccessful. We appeal to our parishioners to be more vigilant and be willing to report to police any suspicious activities or persons inside or outside the facility. Most parts of our facility are now on recorded 24-hour surveillance (\$5500) which are all monitored on the office monitors and mobile devices. Please smile at the cameras! We are introducing more lights (\$1500) in the parking lot, in the vicinity the Adoration Chapel. Perimeter fencing (\$10500) on the Macleod Trail side is being considered. We appeal to our parishioners to be energy-conscious, that is, to use lights only if they are required and to turn them off after use. We are transitioning from regular and CFL light bulbs to LED fixtures in our offices, hall, meeting rooms, storage areas and the rectory or priests' residence. These measures are being undertaken in an effort to use less energy, that is, to lower our energy bills. The entire facility uses a total 239 48-inch 40-watt fluorescent bulbs, plus their accompanying magnetic starters. The hall has 90 bulbs in 30 3bulb fixtures plus 24 in the adjoining storeroom and 27 in the kitchen. The rest are in the joint meeting rooms (54), office (16), sacristy (10), washrooms (13) and hallway (3). The average price for each LED fluorescent replacement bulb is \$12, plus the cost of electronic ballasts. We will proceed with these initiatives only if we receive pledges or actual contributions from generous families or individuals.

Starting November 30, we will transition to using real coffee cups, plates and utensils. This means we need more volunteers willing to spend a little more time and effort to utilize our commercial dish washer as our contribution to save trees and care for our environment. This covers small and big receptions. Commercially prepared finger food is preferred. There are liability issues in serving home-made meals. We must remember that we come to church not to eat but to build community through socials and conversations.

We are still behind on our Together in Action (TIA) contributions. Our excess contributions have been designated for improvements to our Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. We are now studying how to make the chapel wheelchair accessible. There are signs of recovery from our currently running deficit in our operational funds. Hopefully, we will be on the black by the end of the year.
