Pastoral Notes

Cartoonist David Souter designed a series of wares for Royal Doulton, featuring his famous cats in black and white (1906-1934). An art nouveau border, the cats and a saying appeared on each piece. I was gifted with one with the saying: "Trust not him that seems a saint..." Indeed, sanctity is not determined by the appearance. "It is only with the heart that one can see rightly, what is essential is invisible to the eye." (Antoine de Saint-Exupery)

The Pharisees, during the time of Jesus, had lost the true spirit of Judaism and introduced a religion of empty formalism. They placed more importance on exterior performances than the interior spirit of religious faith. This is partly the reason they were opposed to Jesus who insisted on the interior spirit of religion. One's inner choices in the realm of conscience determines moral goodness. "Conscience is the most sacred core and sanctuary of a person. There one is alone with God, whose voice echoes in one's depth. (Gaudium et Spes, 16)

There is of course the human tendency or the strong temptation to replace internal reverence for God with external gestures of piety. It is easier to find a holy picture and fix it in our wall than to find forgiveness for the injuries and insults done to us by others and fix it in our hearts. It is far easier to say or pray "God's will be done" than to accept it in our hearts. When religion consists mainly of externals, pious objects and mechanical recital of formula prayers, it ceases to be true religion and has degenerated into magic and superstition.

The belief that religion is only about the external compliance to its material requirements can lead to hypocrisy and self-righteousness. Self-righteousness is characterized by an unfounded sense of certainty that one is totally correct or morally superior. A self-righteous person thinks that he or she can do no wrong and goes about with a "holier-than-thou" attitude, judging and scrutinizing everyone else.

"Proselytizing" is a religious form of self-righteousness. Trying to convince or impose one's own personal belief or conviction on others is spiritual narrowmindedness.

PHARISEES AND TAX COLLECTORS



Jesus strongly condemned religious hypocrisy. He illustrates this with a story that has lost much of its impact over the centuries. Partially because of the Gospels the name "Pharisee" has taken on a negative aspect. Actually, the Pharisees were the

"good guys". They were a political group organized to defend the rights of migrant farm workers. Modern Judaism can be traced to the better ideals of the Pharisee movement.

In the first century tax collectors were not merely civil servants, they were mercenaries who actually bid for the right to extort from their fellow Jews. Jesus turned the tables by showing that the supposed "sinner" had more humility than the self-proclaimed "holy man."
