Pastoral Notes

As we celebrate Catholic Education Sunday, we reflect on what our Alberta bishops emphasize: "Our Catholic schools exist because of our faith. This faith, the enduring love of Jesus Christ, is what we strive to show to our students. We can only do this if we ourselves also live it. It is a faith that we need to start and end each of our days with. It is a faith that must constantly be fueled if it is to be bright enough to be seen by others... It is only through the spirit of faith that we will see vibrant parishes and schools alive with the love of Jesus Christ. Faith formation is for all of us in the community... Each of us is called to be active members of the Church... We must find opportunities to be inspired by faith so that we may inspire others with our faith. To be people of faith means to be people who pray. Our faith formation must devote time to works of justice, compassion and love. Our faith is strengthened in our participation in the sacraments. Our children are enriched when they see how we proclaim our faith by praying the Our Father at Mass or receiving Christ through the Eucharist..."

The **Communion of Saints**, which is part of our Apostles' Creed, highlights our interrelationship as the Church Militant (pilgrim church) with the Church Penitent (the Souls in Purgatory) and the Church Triumphant (the Saints in heaven). On November 1, we celebrated All Saints Day. We celebrate their role as intercessors for us and for our beloved dead. We invoke and pray for their intercession. Canonized saints are those officially proclaimed by the Church. On November 2, we celebrated the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. We celebrate the love we have shared with our beloved dead, who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. We offer Masses, special prayers and sacrifices for the repose of their souls. We write their names in our Book of Remembrance. We light candles for them. We visit their graves. In a powerful way, the Souls in Purgatory can also intercede for us who are here.

We have a **Liturgy Workshop** (Liturgy 101) on November 8, Friday, 6pm at the Parish Hall. Every Liturgical Minister or anyone interested to volunteer in one of our liturgical ministries is welcome to attend. There will be discussions on the draft protocols for the various ministries.

Mark your calendars... Advent Reflection Evenings on December 2-4 (Monday to Wednesday), 7pm. Fr Edmund will reflect on the following themes: Advent according to Mary (December 2), Advent according to Joseph (December 3) & Advent according to the Church (December 4). A "parish" hall meeting follows each of the sessions with coffee, goodies and "miked" conversations.

A **Program of Activities** (December 2019 to November 2020), to be published this month, requires all ministries and organizations to submit their respective lists of activities, including regular meetings, workshops and socials and if applicable, their respective budgetary requirements. If your ministry or group has not submitted yet, please do so anytime soon. This will help us schedule our parish events in advance to avoid double bookings, conflict of schedules and to accommodate diocesan and other parish-affiliated groups to book our facilities. We are starting a fundraiser to transition into LED lighting. You can contribute \$10 for each of the total of more than 250 fluorescent LED replacement bulbs required for the transition. The transition will immediately help us lower our power consumption. Please consider making a pledge or an actual contribution for this purpose.

We are still behind on our Together in Action (TIA) contributions. As of this writing, we have contributed \$21,465.00 of the total target goal of \$44,787.00. Any excess contributions will be designated to our Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel improvements. A study is underway to make the chapel wheelchair accessible.

ZACCHAEUS AND THE SYCAMORE



Jericho is a city of turning points. It is an oasis that serves as a crossroads between Galilee and Jerusalem and between Israel, Jordan and Egypt. It is here that Jesus will take the road that will lead to Calvary. It is also the home of a hated and rich, mercenary tax collector named Zacchaeus. His fellow

Jews see him only as a collaborator with the Roman occupation forces. He has reached the peak of his career but is unsatisfied. He has few if any friends. His last chance may be to reform by turning to Jesus. Being short of stature, he climbs a sycamore tree. This is not the stately plant of America, nor that of Eurasia. It is a variety of fruit tree, often known as the "poor man's fig". There is a bit of satire in the fact that he climbs a plant grown for the impoverished.
