Pastoral Notes

The Resurrection Factor

When the resurrection, as in eternity, becomes part of our life's equation, we realize that nothing is really ours, except the borrowed time we now spend. When one trusts in God, eternity or our own resurrection from the dead becomes an essential part of one's plans and projects. It even can become the supreme fulfillment of the faithful heart, whose greatest desire is to pass on to God, at last.

The hope of eternity teaches us how to live, that is, meaningfully. Eternity's inevitability through death cuts through our shallowness, complacency and our sense of competition, pride and prejudice. Eternity makes us discover our need for God and others. It gives our human relationships perspective.

The prospect of rising from death into eternity teaches us that the things we now enjoy in this world are given to us as gifts of God which we have to share with the rest of the world. The hope of eternity inspires us to generous, to be self-giving. It inspires us to think about the legacy and the contribution we have to make for the betterment of our world and society. Eternal life that comes after this life becomes our inspiration to seek the things that really last, things that outlive death and its power over us.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus speaks of God as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and not as the God of the dead but of the living. For God, all of them are alive. He calls those who rise from the dead "children of the resurrection". They will inherit the new world and its eternal life. They live forever because they are God's children. He brings back to life those He loves as children. As a loving Father, God wants us to live forever which is a word that is always used for real love. Our present life can be pleasant enough, like a comfortable accommodation or hotel. But this is not home. Our true home is Heaven, where the Father is waiting for us.

Peter Kreeft in a book entitled "Heaven and Hell", writes: "We are children, however hard we try to cover that up. There are no grown-ups. When we get old, we only exchange our toys: business for bats, sex for sleds, power for popguns. At death our Father calls: Come little ones. Time to put away our toys and come home... Home – that's what heaven is. It won't appear strange and faraway and supernatural, but utterly natural. Heaven is what we were designed for. Heaven is not escapist. Earth is escapist. Heaven is home."
