# Hail, Joseph!

We find in Joseph a principled person faithful to his own Jewish tradition who would rather prefer compassion than legalism. Even though Joseph did not completely comprehend the implications of his dream, he responded with faith to the messenger of God. Joseph, together with Mary, sought to do the right thing, believing that God would be with them in their own respective life journeys.

Joseph is a model of husbandry and fatherhood, especially in our own times. Here is a husband and father whose role is more of following the divine will than seeking his own human preference in taking care of his wife and his son. The basis of his loving and caring relationship is more moral and spiritual than physical which is not existent after all.

We look up to Joseph in his selfless dedication to his family. Joseph is also a model of unity for our families and world communities. Joseph embodies the principle of unity based on the fatherhood of God. His selfless attitude to what has happened in his own life is an outstanding character that is needed in our elusive search for peace and unity in our world. It is an attitude that requires full trust and confidence in God for whom, through whom and from whom we all have our being. It is an attitude of a creature that acknowledges the complete and total jurisdiction of the Creator.

Like Joseph, we are challenged to be faithful to the message of God in the unfolding events of our lives. We don't have to be larger than life. We are not, after all. We have to go through our lives with the magnanimity of heart that made Joseph follow the will of God in his life to the end. We are part of the God's entire plan.

According to Pope Benedict XVI, "his example helps us to understand that it is only by complete submission to the will of God that we be become effective workers in the service of His plan to gather together all mankind into one family."

# ST. ANTHONY'S CHRISTMAS HAMPER REPORT TO PARISHIONERS

61 hampers delivered to 86 Adults and 58 Children.

An average hamper is valued at \$200 and consists of one weeks' worth of non-perishable food, paper and soap products, toiletries, bread, milk and margarine, potatoes, and carrots, onions, chicken or ham, apples and oranges, for a Christmas meal, and presents for the children.


- St. Anthony's purchased food totaling \$2,620 for 51 hampers using generous donations received throughout the year.
- St. Augustine's School families collected enough non-perishable food to fill 10 additional hampers.
- St. Augustine's School families collected adult toiletries and the children made Christmas cards for 61 hampers.

Country Lane Farms donated 50 chickens valued at \$1402. Calgary Italian Bakery donated 50 loaves of bread. Junior Foods Ltd. donated 4 cases of potatoes.

- St. Anthony's purchased an additional \$200 of perishable food and 7 presents valued at \$355 to complete 11 hampers.
- St. Augustine teachers purchased 18 children's gifts and St. Anthony's parishioners purchased 31 children's gifts.
- St. Anthony's parishioners donated \$1275 and \$50 in gift cards as well as candy and games for 8 families and biscuits for 10 adults through the Angel Tree.
- 44 volunteers sorted, packed and delivered 51 hampers and 10 volunteers sorted, packed and delivered 10 hampers, totaling approximately 250 volunteer hours.

Italo Sartoria donated \$1000 and the Filipino Society donated \$100 to the Christmas hamper program.
