Dear members and friends of St. John,

One of the greatest controversies in Lutheran Church history has been the introduction of **alternate worship forms**. These have come to the LC-MS in the last fifty years, including contemporary worship, praise worship, and various forms that blend traditional worship with modern music and dance. How are we to look at alternate worship in the Church?

**First, we must look at the culture we live in.** In many ways, the 1960's led to a total upheaval in a person's freedom to express oneself. This postmodern worldview states that each person has a right to *challenge* the norms of society – what is right and wrong, what is practiced and what is rejected. This notion of **total individual freedom** has greatly impacted the Christian church. Couple this to the hedonism of this age which boldly claims that there are **no absolute truths**. From a Christian perspective, the culture is racing to embrace sin, while rejecting God's holy word.

**Another societal change is growing isolationism.** Our society has become increasingly isolated from **group culture identity**, meaning computers and the Internet have allowed people to avoid direct involvement in a group setting, in favor of privacy and isolation. For example, fifty years ago clubs and organizations thrived throughout our culture. Today they're becoming increasingly rare. People can be coerced into spending a limited amount in time public service or in public protests for a cause that concerns them, but getting them to commit to help organize and run the operations of a group is very challenging. Social media posts may get them to flock to a rally, but that's the extent of their involvement.

An important teaching of Jesus Christ is His command that we be "in, but not of" this world (John 17:11-18). But today's young adults choose very limited avenues in which they will be "in" this world, allowing themselves to be close to a limited number of friends or family. Therefore, organized religion is antithetical to today's culture because it requires that we "join in" with complete strangers in a group setting, and commit to this on a weekly basis.

**Today's postmodern, isolationistic culture therefore runs headlong into Jesus' desire for His Church. The Church necessarily is countercultural.** By this I mean that Christ's central teachings are in nearly complete opposition to our American culture. First, there *is* real "truth" in the world. Jesus says, "I am the way, **the truth**, and the life" (John 14:6). Indeed, God's Word points to the only absolute truth that exists in the world – God's demand for justice, and His unfailing love.

Next, there's the requirement that **we work with others**, combining our gifts and talents with theirs, to accomplish a **greater good**. God has given us unique talents and, we must combine ours to have the greatest impact on the world around us. This notion of **shedding our individual rights, and privacy, to be part of something greater than ourselves**, is central to Christianity. St. Paul refers to this as being a member of the **"body of Christ."** Each individual, isolated from others, is weak and ineffectual. Together, the sum is vastly greater than the parts.

**So, how do these cultural and societal changes affect the way people chose to worship?** The answer is in dramatic ways. Today's individualistic, isolated American wants worship to meet their demands for freedom: choosing what they believe and rejecting what they dislike, while remaining disconnected from messy entanglements of sharing with others. Worship must satisfy the individual's basic emotional and "spiritual" needs and wants, or else.

And how has the American church (including churches in the LC-MS) answered their demands? Alternate worship forms. Interestingly, the greatest demands for change in worship does not come from our youth, or even millennials; it comes from **baby boomers** (those born between 1946 and 1962).

Baby boomers have been the change agents in the American church, beginning with the placement of limits on what is communicated from the pulpit. When I first arrived at St. John, a few leaders approached me and told me what topics were "off limits" for my sermons. **Abortion** and **cohabitation** were **not** to be discussed. Too many people will be offended. My reply was not well received. I would not allow limits to be placed on what I communicate from the pulpit. This demand to limit God's word is not uncommon in the LCMS. It stems from the idea that worship must **not be offensive** to the worshippers. But God's demands, in the form of His laws and decrees, are always going to be offensive to those who demand Christianity on *their* terms.

The next change demanded of the church is **music that is satisfactory to the "audience**." Contemporary praise songs largely focus on "me." "My" feelings, "my" walk with God, "my" needs being met. They border on entertainment. They may include mantras, statements repeated over and over again to change our mood or thinking through repetition of thought. However, the power of God's word is not found through pop psychology, but the Spirit working through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In response to these pressures from the world, the **Church's worship must take up the task of** *opposing* **the culture. This makes worship countercultural.** In reply to the demands that the word be limited to that which is not offensive, we must be resolute in our worship to proclaim the **whole counsel of God**, both God's terrifying judgment of sinners and His comforting forgiveness for the sake of Christ. Though the world will forever persuade the Church to soften its prophetic message, we remain determined to proclaim the truth, fully aware that the Gospel-indeed, Christ Himself-is a stumbling block (Matt. 21:42; 1 Cor. 1:18-25).

Our worship will also strive to resist other trends that have come to characterize our society. For example, the perception that **everything we do in worship** *must be relevant* should **not** be an excuse for allowing our wants and needs to dictate the agenda of the service. The genius of the Church's historic liturgy - and why it has found continued use in diverse cultures over centuries — is its ability to focus on the heart of the matter, namely, our condition as sinners in need of a gracious God.

Removing or changing the liturgy must be done with the utmost care, for all of worship is designed to **kill the old Adam in us, replacing it with the new person in Christ Jesus**. This process began in our Baptism, and is called Sanctification. Our selfish desires must give way to the desire to serve our neighbor out of love. Our love of entertainment and self-satisfaction must give way to the discipline of God's holy word, found in the liturgy, readings, sermon, and hymns. **Hymns focus our hearts and minds on God's word**, instead of feelings and emotions that **do not** build up the soul. **Ultimately, each parishioner should expect worship to be an attack on what our**  culture says is "good," with a strong proclamation of the Truth that kills the old sinful self, and grows and sustains our new life in Christ. Yes, worship is going to be "other worldly." And that's a good thing! May God help us seek that which builds-up, yes, that which is contrary to what the world holds as precious – as we worship our Living Lord.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL HAPPENINGS

# Spiritual Blindness and the Cure

## Dr. Martin Luther emphatically states that **unless you have a clear understanding of Original Sin, the rest of Scripture will remain a "sealed" book for you.**

Furthermore, unless you understand how the power of Original Sin-a horrific demonic power now working silently within you- intends to eventually destroy your faith, you have no way to protect yourself. **Thus, the following article could be the most important information you will ever read in your life.** 

Luther admitted human illustrations could not fully explain God's mysteries. Yet, he said illustrations often provide a "faint understanding:" Such is the case with the following article, which uses the eye disease "glaucoma" to explain the deadly spiritual disease God says is now working silently within you.

Glaucoma is an eye disease affecting 65 million people around the world in every age group. While glaucoma is incurable, it is treatable; however, if left untreated, glaucoma can lead to blindness. The good news for you is that glaucoma can be controlled and damage to your eye can be stopped.

## **QUESTIONS FOR CLARIFICATION**

QUESTION: What is glaucoma and what part of the eye does it attack?

**ANSWER:** The human eye, with its optic nerve, contain two small tubes. One tube brings necessary liquid into your eye. The other tube drains off excess liquid so that too much pressure does not build up within your eye. If the excess liquid is not drained from within your eye, damaging pressure will slowly build, eventually causing you to develop "tunnel" vision. If untreated, glaucoma will close in your vision entirely and eventually, you will become completely blind.

As already stated, glaucoma is NOT CURABLE. Previous damage is NOT REPAIRABLE; however, your physician can provide eye drops which, when applied daily, will prevent any further damage.

## A STRIKING SIMILARITY!

There is a striking similarity between the eye disease called glaucoma and the demonic disease God says you now have working deep within you-the power of Sin.

You do not feel glaucoma working in your eyes. You also do not feel the spiritual infection, or disease, the Bible calls Original Sin. Like glaucoma, which must be revealed to you by your earthly physician, you can only know Original Sin when your divine Physician reveals it to you through His Word.

Glaucoma slowly closes in your vision, eventually blinding you. *Spiritual glaucoma* does the same damage. Your heavenly Father urges you to "*[fix your] eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfector of [your] faith*" (Hebrews 12:2). The devil, however, seeks to divert you from Christ as he tempts you to skip worship, to not take Holy Communion, and when you fail to pray regularly. This is like failing to put the glaucoma eye drops in your eyes. The consequence? Spiritual glaucoma begins to close in your spiritual vision, eventually blinding you so that you no longer see Christ and His blessings clearly. You no longer have direction in life because you cannot see and follow the Good Shepherd (John 10:14, 27). When spiritual glaucoma sets in, you no longer see Jesus, the Bread of Life, from whom you receive spiritual nourishment (John 6:35). When spiritual glaucoma begins its destruction, you begin to lose track of where to find Jesus-who offers you the water of life (John 4:14). When spiritual glaucoma sets in, you can no longer see the bloody crucifixion cross and the Good News Jesus has for you through His suffering and death: "*By His stripes you are healed*" (Isaiah 53:4-6 KJV).

Every Christian family can tell tragic stories about family members who have permitted spiritual glaucoma (Original Sin) to slowly blot out their spiritual vision. Their vision of Jesus and all He has to offer them becomes increasingly closed in and eventually invisible. No longer seeing all the blessings Jesus has to offer them, these pitiful sheep turn away from their loving Shepherd. They begin to follow other voices and disguises of the devil. These same sheep attend church less and less,

eventually dropping completely out of the faith. The devil uses his tool of Original Sin, the power of Sin, to slowly blind people and eventually take their soul into the eternal bondage of hell.

## THE BAD NEWS FOR YOU!

The above paragraphs are not simply general religious information. God is speaking specifically to you. The bad news is that God says *you* have incurable spiritual glaucoma. If untreated, this spiritual glaucoma will slowly blind you from seeing Jesus, thereby causing you to follow false gods and misleading messiahs.

## **GOOD NEWS FOR YOU!**

Here is God's Good News. In the first five verses of Romans 6, one-fifth of the chapter, God explains Baptism, the miracle He has for you to stave off spiritual glaucoma and spiritual blindness. To ensure that you have clear spiritual vision, God first gives you His miracle of Baptism to "unite" you to His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ (Romans 6:5). After God explains that He has united you to Christ, He then devotes the remaining four-fifths of the chapter not to the specific "miracle-event" of Baptism, but to the ONGOING POWER OF BAPTISM! God wants you to know that His miracle of Baptism is His *ongoing power*, working to fight spiritual glaucoma in your life.

Why do many clergy, especially in non-denominational churches, avoid these important and lifesaving sections of God's Word? They avoid them because they come to God's Word insisting that, before they can believe, things must be logical and reasonable. To say God's miracle of Baptism fights against our evil thoughts and actions is not very logical. Yet, God's miracles for His children are above reason. Consequently, Evangelicals and many other non-denominational Protestants disagree with Lutherans and other Christians around the world who believe in the power of God's Baptism. They argue that Baptism is not necessary, completely rejecting God's teaching that the **ongoing power** of Baptism is the key to their sanctified life. Nowhere in God's Word does He speak more clearly and emphatically about the Antidote to the power of Sin than He does in connection with Baptism (Romans 6; Colossians 2). Even if you cannot feel or see the power of Baptism at work in you, trust God's promise: "Consider yourself to be dead to sin and alive to God in Christ" (Romans 6:11).

## LUTHER EXPOSES THE DEVIL'S DECEPTION

But even many Lutherans are not aware of the need and the power of Baptism to *daily* fight the power of Sin. See how Dr. Luther explains how clever the devil has been at misleading people regarding the *ongoing* and daily power of God's miracle of Baptism:

"I say this to correct the opinion, which has long prevailed among us, that Baptism is something past that we can no longer use after falling back into sin. This idea comes from looking only at the *act* that took place a single time ... This takes away the value of Baptism, making it of no further use to us" *(The Book of Concord,* Large Catechism, Part IV, 80, 82).

## HOW DO YOU RESPOND TO GOD'S DIAGNOSIS OF YOUR SPIRITUAL GLAUCOMA?

What is God offering you as daily Medicine, a remedy to insure that Satan does not slowly constrict your vision of God's grace in Jesus so that the devil cannot spiritually blind you and prevent you

from seeing Jesus, who is your forgiveness and salvation?

God ensures your *spiritual* vision by working in every generation through the Medicine of His living, creative Word. Your heavenly Father is, at this very hour, working to ensure light in your life (John 5:17). Through the prophet Isaiah, God told His Old Testament children not to fear spiritual glaucoma: "*The people who walk in darkness will see a great light*" (Isaiah 9:2). Jesus stated: "*I am the Light of the world; he who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the Light of life*" (John 8:12). Without Jesus, the Light of the World, you will become a slave to the powers of darkness and to the power of Sin. However, when you are united to Christ through God's miracle of Baptism, "*Sin shall not be master over you*" (Romans 6:14).

In Romans 6, God tells you the Good News of how He has, through Baptism, delivered you from spiritual glaucoma, blindness, and slavery to darkness. By uniting you to the Light of the World, He has removed your spiritual glaucoma. As your Baptism is renewed daily through His Word, God will prevent spiritual glaucoma and the powers of darkness from overcoming you.

## YOUR NEW LIFE: FREEDOM FROM THE POWER OF SIN

As His Spirit, through His Word, works to prevent you from becoming enslaved to the powers of darkness, He speaks of this new power for you to walk in newness of life by describing it as a garment you put on.

Through the apostle Paul, God says: "*For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ*"(Galatains 3:27). St. Paul repeats the idea of "clothing yourself" or "putting on" the Lord Jesus Christ for protection from the power of flesh and sin: "But **put on** the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh in regard to its lusts" (Romans 13:14).

Again, to the Ephesian Christians, Paul writes: "*And put on the new self*" (Ephesians 4:24). To the Colossian Christians also, Paul writes: "*Put on the new self*" (Colossians 3:10). It would be foolish for your 10-year-old child to **put on** clothes one morning and never take them off, hoping they will serve his needs until the end of life. In the same way, it is foolish and unbiblical to think of having **put on** Christ once, and this is **putting on** is complete for the rest of one's life. As noted throughout the New Testament, this **putting on** is an everyday activity.

**QUESTION:** In a very practical sense, what does it mean to **put on** Christ, so that "the old Adam" or "Original Sin" in us should, by "daily contrition and repentance, drown and die with all sins and evil lusts, and, again, a new man daily come forth and arise?"

**ANSWER:** This **putting on** means that, each morning, when you read God's Ten Commandments, this living Word of God's Law acts as a mirror, showing you the sin in your life, "*I would not have come to know sin except through the Law*" (Romans 7:7). Then, when you speak the Apostles' Creed (a short summary of God's saving work for you), you receive the sweet balm of God's healing and life-giving Gospel. All of this efficacious Medicine, this divine Remedy, this Balm of Gilead comes to you as, each morning, you pray the Lord's Prayer.

This entire cleansing and healing process, this spiritual procedure of **putting off** the "flesh," the power of Sin (Colossians 2:11), and **putting on** Christ, also takes place every Sunday in the worship service where you confess your sins, your pastor announces God's forgiveness in the Absolution,

where Christ is received in the Holy Supper, and God's Law and Gospel are proclaimed in the liturgy, the hymns, and the sermon.

Luther sums up how God prepares you to fight the devil. The first step is **putting on** Christ in Baptism:

"Thus we see what a great and excellent thing Baptism is, which snatches us from the jaws of the devil and makes us God's own, overcomes and takes away sin and daily strengthens the new person, and always endures and remains until we pass out of this misery into eternal glory" (*The Book of Concord*, Large Catechism, Part IV, 83).

#### LUTHER NEXT STRESSES YOUR NEED TO DAILY CALL UPON GOD'S CONTINUED POWER OF BAPTISM TO FIGHT ORIGINAL SIN

Thousands, if not millions, of Lutherans-and other Christians-would like to lead a more godly life. They need to reacquaint themselves with Luther's Bible-based advice regarding the ongoing power of Baptism for the Christian life. With a question and answer Dr. Luther explains:

"What then is the [ongoing] significance of such a Baptism with water?"

It signifies that the old creature (Old Adam) in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned and die **THROUGH DAILY CONTRITION AND REPENTANCE**, and on the other hand that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Where is this written? Answer:

St. Paul says in Romans 6:4, "We were buried with Christ through Baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we, too, are to walk in a new life"(The Small Catechism, Part IV, 12-14).

No section of God's Word is more challenging to understand and apply to daily life than the final words of the above verse of Scripture. God promises that, in Christ, you are free from the slavery to sin and that you can now "walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4). Why is this simple but powerful phrase, "walk in newness of life" so often ignored? All of us, including you, want to be in the driver's seat of a new life. The devil misleads you to believe your new life is something you do. This is wrong. **The new life** God is speaking about is **not what you do**, but **what He does through Christ in you** (Galatians 2:20; 1 Corinthians 1:30). This new life happens when, as Luther explains above, you live a life of daily repentance. Daily contrition and repentance means you daily review the Ten Commandments where God shows you your sin, recite the Apostles' Creed to confess your rescue from sin by Christ, and then pray the Lord's Prayer, the daily channel through which God desires to bless you, His child.

Renew your Baptism each day. The water of God's Word will enable you to fix "your eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfector of [your] faith' (Hebrews 12:2).
