## Education Programs 2018 - 2019

#### **KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 2:**

The Secwépemc were very conscious of our impacts on the land, and therefore ensured that we used the land in a sustainable way. Explore a tailored Pre-Contact tour and learn about the Secwépemc knowledge of seasonal rounds, including food gathering, hunting and fishing.

#### **GRADE 3:**

The Secwépemc had deep connections to the land and our survival of was based on our thorough knowledge the land. Explore a tailored Pre-Contact tour and learn about Secwépemc place names of local landmarks and areas of cultural importance. Through this tour, students will learn the local Secwépemc place names for mountains, waterways and other areas in the Kamloops area.

#### GRADE 4 and 5:

Early Secwépemc and early settlers and fur traders first made contact in the 1800s. Explore and learn about the Secwépemc and their recorded experiences with early Europeans. This tour will start to unravel the impact of colonialization of First Nations and the history of Secwepemc and the Residential School System.





## Education Programs 2018 - 2019

#### **GRADE 6 AND 7:**

With the grade 6 and 7 educational program, students can gain a better understanding about historical and current Secwépemc uses of plants and how we used extraction methods to provide medicine, pigments, etc. Through this tour delve into the past and learn about Traditional Ecological Knowledge of sustainable practices, ethnobotany and climate change. Tours can also be scheduled for the Residential School System.

#### **GRADE 8 - 12 Program**

Choose between the Residential School Tour and the Pre-Contact Tour.

With the pre-contact tour, students will have an opportunity to gain an insightful look into the rich Secwépemc history and culture before colonization. Gain a greater understanding of the people that have been here since time immemorial.

With the Residential School Tour, we provide insight, and an excellent learning opportunity into the untold history of residential schools in Canada, more specifically the Kamloops Indian Residential School, one of the largest operated schools in Canada.
