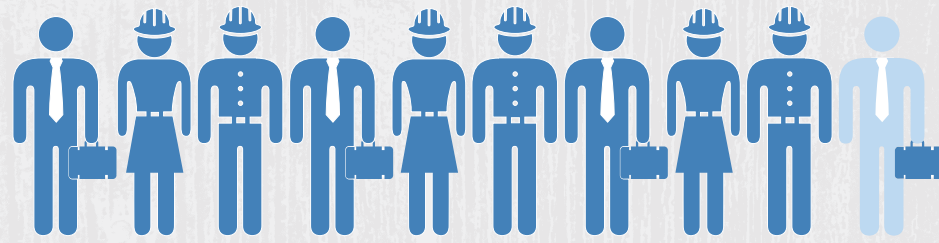




# FUELING JOB CREATION



The U.S. oil and gas industry already supports *9.2 million jobs.*

With policies in place that encourage oil and gas development, the industry could support another *1,000,000 jobs* in 10 YEARS.

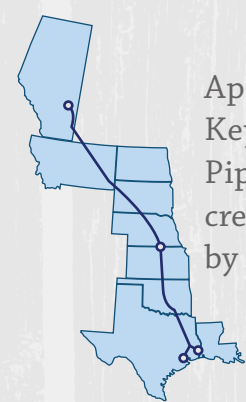
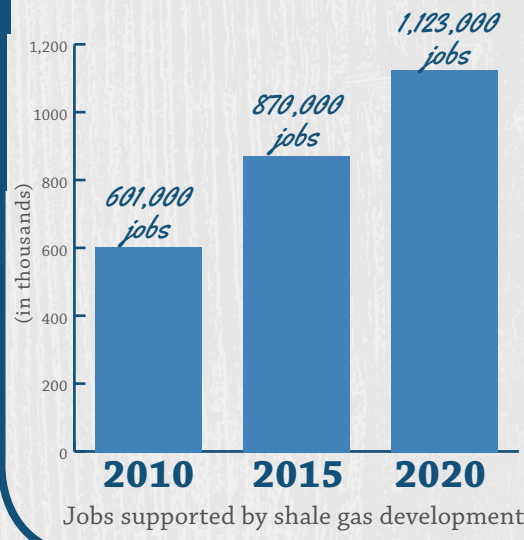
Shale gas development could support *1.6 million jobs* by 2035.

Those jobs would be created in the following sectors:

- 47% **Services**
- 13% **Manufacturing**
- 12% **Mining**
- 12% **Retail and Wholesale**
- 7% **Transportation**
- 6% **Construction**
- 1% **Agriculture**
- 1% **Government**



Shale gas development is creating tens of thousands of jobs every year. Between 2010 and 2015, it's estimated that the *rate of job creation in the industry will be 7.7%.*

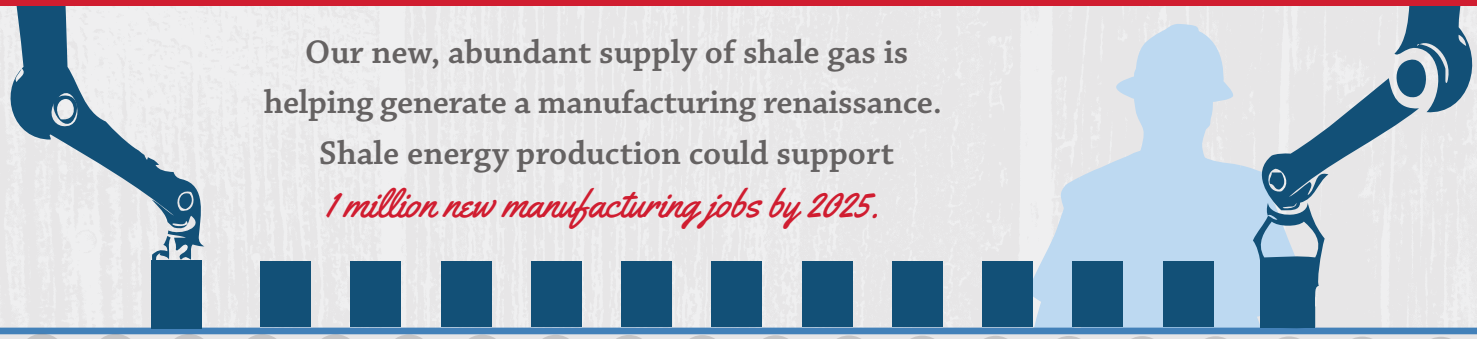


Approval of the Keystone XL Pipeline could create *85,000 jobs* by 2020.

Access to federal waters off the Gulf Coast of Florida could create *100,000 jobs* by 2016.
