

Isaiah 11; 1-3

.... The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him;  
The Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding;  
The Spirit of Council and Fortitude;  
The Spirit of Knowledge and fear of the Lord;  
And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord

[Oh I'm sure Jesus feared God the Father!]

The Peshitta, an Aramaic translation, illustrates the last two as Reverence of the Lord. Perhaps the early Greek writers were unable to find a better term back then.

However, the Septuagint and the Vulgate read 'Piety' in place of the first occurrence, thus illustrating seven fulfillments of the Holy Spirit. Devotion was found as a common reflection to that term. It's also well noted among his profound qualities.

So in summary, the seven fulfillments read as; Wisdom; Understanding; Council; Fortitude; Knowledge; Devotion and Reverence of the Lord.

The first six are actives, where the seventh is an acknowledgement and respect for the source of life. We all have the ability to strive for those virtues. Even if we acquired only part of his potential, they would be rewarding achievements still.
