Many have unfortunately retrieved little wisdom from the bible, which is natural. The separate books or writings were written by different authors, for different reasons and most out of sequence or dating timeline. The Bible cannot be read '*cover to cover*' and understood properly. There are some issues concerning validation of who wrote the four Gospels. All Biblical Spotlight revealing's, (as noted by the above site), comes from encyclopedic and learned historical and blog references. It is well known who wrote the first three synoptic gospels, but almost all agree there is a second writer style inserted in John. This was one of my first troubling finds. That discovery led on and up to a whole wealth of revelations about *why* Jesus needed to teach truth on how their religious life style had gone horribly bad. *This fact is still unspoken of today!!*

However, please look up a famous painting of the six dogs around a pool table entitled, 'Hustler', by Arthur Sarnoff. Each are placed very well in comparison to human nature, but take a closer look at who's holding the money and who the bulldog's opponent is. I think you'll get the idea. Now go back to that strange section in Isaiah and you'll see the similarities. Each of the animal illustrations are dictating many 'Different' characters of man. Not all biblical scripture is meant to be viewed as true to every word as you read it, but rather, towards a *relative* demonstration.
