

Student Injuries and Insurance

Dear Parent/Legal Guardian:

We are committed to providing a safe environment for your student. Even so, accidents do happen, and resulting medical treatment (ambulance transport, surgery, hospitalization, etc.) can be very expensive. Further, California law (Ed Code 20220-24) requires every member of an athletic team to have at least \$1,500 of medical and hospital coverage.

Please know that MBUSD is not liable for these expenses and does not provide medical insurance coverage for school or sports-related accidents. However, as a service to you and your child, MBUSD offers you the ability to voluntarily purchase a low-cost student accident/sickness insurance program administered by Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc. (www.myers-stevens.com). If your child has other health insurance, the Myers-Stevens insurance may be able to be used to supplement eligible charges not covered by their primary plan.

Information and enrollment forms are available in the school office or from the athletic department and may be found at https://www.mbusd.org/apps/pages/Student Insurance. To enroll, complete the enrollment form in full, select the plan(s) you want for your child, and return with payment as directed on the form. Once processing is completed, an ID card verifying coverage will be mailed home to you.
