I want to thank my cousin Tony, from Speedway and his friend Jenny, from Indian Rocks Florida. Becky and I were stranded in Dothan Alabama with no hotel to be found and they found us one for 4 nights.

As everyone should know by now, our Treasure Hunt was hit, and we started a new one at \$8,000 – it is currently over \$11,000. This game has been slow to grow - it will never build if people don't come in. Also, our Queen of Hearts was hit, and I will start a new game called United We Stand. By the time you receive this newsletter it will be running. This game will not have a cap on it like the Queen of Hearts did. This game will be sold all week and I will sell tickets on Fridays starting at 4:30 pm. Drawing will be at 7:30 pm on Fridays.
