## **Verbal Gestures**

Like any conversation, an essay that is a writer's conversation with others about a question that matters to them includes verbal gestures. These are words or phrases like those below. Some are gestures that invite sources to provide <code>background</code> on the question so that everyone understands what has already been said. Other gestures signal <code>analysis</code>, or a closer examination and critique of something someone said. Sometimes these verbal gestures signify <code>speculation</code>; the writer just isn't quite sure what to think for sure but maybe.... Or they might indicate <code>alignment</code>—statements in which the writer is taking sides with a particular idea, position, or certain way of seeing.

Consider whether verbal gestures like these will help you manage the conversation about your topic.
