In Dorothy's words:

I wrote *'Children Learn What They Live'* in 1954 as part of my weekly column on creative family living for a local newspaper in Southern California. At the time, I was 30 years old and the mother of 2 children.

"Writing this poem was my way of responding to parent's questions in my family-life classes. It speaks to their concerns about what it means to be a parent. Little did I know that it would seem to have a life of its own. Over its 60+ years, it has been modified, excerpted and adapted many, many times – usually without my knowledge. And yet, the poem survives to help generations of parents to better understand and guide their children."

"Children do learn what they live. Then they grow up to *live* what they've learned."
