You can find colored or plain sand at most craft stores. After the Justice of the Peace reads the text below (or any text you choose), The Bride and Groom pours the two containers of sand into the third container, simultaneously. You may wish to leave a small amount of sand in each container to symbolize that although you are now joined as one, you each remain individuals.

ogether as one. Just as these grains of sand can never be separated and poured again
nto the individual containers, so will your marriage be.
