Many automotive enthusiasts know that Alice Cooper, besides being a rock and roll legend, is also a big time car guy. Mr. Cooper has a number of custom vehicles named after his albums. A few of those vehicles have even crossed the auction block at Barrett-Jackson in Scottsdale, AZ.

Mr. Cooper is having a customized Mustang built for him by a local custom shop, <u>Innovation Performance</u>. The same manufacturer that built the #55 1969 Trans Am and the 1968 "Bullitt" displayed at the Museum.

Alice Cooper's Mustang will be revealed to the attending guests, as part of the <u>2020 National Mustang Day</u>. Our understanding this will be the first time the public will have the opportunity to view this one of a kind Mustang.

Unfortunately, we do not have photos to share, in fact, all we know is that it is a 1st Generation Mustang, with an unbelievable sound system.

We do not know how long we will be able to display Mr. Cooper's Mustang at the Museum.

As you can imagine this vehicle will receive a lot of media attention.
