Lighted Magnifier:

Thanks to a donation by Rita & Tim McCarthy, we have a **lighted floor stand magnifier** for patron use. It is beside the newspaper rack and available for reading the news beside the fireplace, or at any other table for research, or for crafting in the meeting room.



Tax Forms: As of the writing of this newsletter, Federal tax forms **have not yet arrived** at the Rush Library, even though they were ordered last fall. I expect further delays due to the government shut-down in January. I am not expecting any NYS forms this year. I called and requested some, but they have not been sent for the last five years. You can download NYS forms at <u>http://www.tax.ny.gov/</u> and Federal forms at <u>https://www.irs.gov/Forms-&-Pubs</u> and see the instruction books online, or stop in and see our library staff members for help. (We expect to have a very limited amount of free common forms; printing out unusual forms at the library will cost you 15¢ per page.)

Items placed in our book-drop before we open for the day are always backdated to the last day we were open.
