Hurricane and Storm Planning June 2017

San Marco Condominium of Sarasota

Definition of Hurricane & Storm Watches/Warnings:

Hurricane *Watch*: A hurricane is likely within 36 hours Hurricane *Warning*: A hurricane is expected within 24 hrs

Storm Watch: A threat exists within 36 hours

Storm Warning: Storm conditions expected within 24 hrs

Evacuation Zones: San Marco is in Zone D, which is the next-to-last zone to be evacuated in Sarasota.

There are various storm shelters in Sarasota County; a few are pet-friendly. Pet-friendly shelters will only take dogs and cats that must be in crates and carry vaccination records. Shelter locations information is available at: https://www.scgov.net/StormCenter/Pages/ShelterList.aspx

Storm Preparation Checklist for San Marco Residents:

- Prepare an evacuation/survival kit of prescription medications, water, cash (ATMs may fail), credit cards, identification cards, phone numbers, insurance information, cell phones and flashlights.
- Fill vehicle fuel tank. Gas stations may be closed during emergencies and unable to pump gas during power outages. Become familiar with alternate routes/other means of transportation out of the area.
- Use a camera or camcorder to photograph and prepare an inventory of your possessions for insurance documentation purposes. Do this <u>BEFORE</u> a storm or hurricane is predicted.
- Have adequate homeowner and windstorm insurance in place.
- San Marco does *not* have an emergency power generator. If municipal power is interrupted, there will be no power for cooking, air conditioning, refrigerators, lights, computers, or Internet and email access.
- Make arrangements for special needs or disability transport if required, particularly during the period when elevators will be shut down. Note the Special Needs contact number listed above.

- Have a supply of flashlights, batteries, potable water, a non-electric can opener, and a few days' supply of canned food that will not require heating or cooking. Keep a fire extinguisher in your apartment.
- Fill bathtubs with water for flushing toilets in case municipal water or power for our domestic water pumps is not available.
- Have at least one hard-wired telephone that does not require batteries or need wall power or a charger.
- Have on hand a battery-powered radio and/or TV, with fresh batteries.
- Check with local storm preparation publications for a list of items that should be kept on hand and ready for use during a serious storm or evacuation.
- If there is an evacuation of San Marco, residents should leave the building by the stairways. <u>Be sure to take your stairway key with you</u>. Elevators will not be available unless local fire and safety officials say they can be used during the evacuation.
- If you must evacuate the building or leave the area during a storm, notify the Association President, Manager and a San Marco neighbor, so someone knows you have left the building and can contact you, if needed.
- If municipal power fails, unplug appliances to prevent surge damage when power is restored.
- Residents must clear balconies and patios of all items. Residents should assume that there will be no one
 available to assist them with the removal of items from their balconies and patios. Residents should
 make arrangements in advance for storm-preparation assistance OR clear their balconies before
 hurricane season begins.
- Absent seasonal owners/tenants <u>MUST TURN OFF</u> the water supply to the unit. Air conditioners should not be set higher than 80 degrees and the humidistat should be set to 50% humidity.
- Keep valuable furnishings or fragile items away from windows. Check that windows and sliding patio
 doors are securely closed and locked. Wind can sometimes loosen and unlock sliding doors, so consider
 placing a snug, pre-measured wooden dowel or a piece of PVC pipe in each slider track during a storm
 so the door cannot unlock and slide open.
- Heavy winds may cause some water to enter the inside track of sliding patio doors. This is normal.
 Before a storm be sure that weep holes in the lower window frame, and the window slider track, are clear of all dirt and other material so exiting water does not get blocked.
- San Marco residential windows comply with the Miami/Dade code and do not need to be shuttered. Close all drapes and blinds.
- Because of the threat of fire, avoid the use of candles during a power outage associated with a hurricane or serious storm. Use of hibachi grills, all other charcoal cookers, and electric grills are NOT permitted in the units, on the balconies, on the terraces, on the patio deck or pool deck.

- Check the contents of your storage locker and remove items that might be damaged from a broken pipe
 or other water leaks. Place all items in lower storage lockers on raised platforms or pallets, or in water
 resistant covered plastic bins to avoid damage in case water enters the storage room floor, or a broken
 pipe or leak from the roof floods the room.
- During a hurricane or serious storm, absent owners can check the San Marco web site at
 <u>www.sanmarcocondo.com</u> for periodic storm status reports, provided there is electric power and Internet
 access is available in Sarasota.

Evacuation; Physical - Special Needs Planning

If there is an evacuation of San Marco, residents should leave the building by the stairways. Be sure to take a stairway key with you. The elevators will most likely not be available unless local fire and safety officials direct that they may be used during evacuation. If you must evacuate the building or leave the area during a storm, please be sure notify the Manager and also a San Marco neighbor, so someone knows you have left the building and can contact you if needed.

If you will require physical assistance to use the stairs or exit the building, or need to be transported to a shelter, you should register **in advance** with the Sarasota County:

You should register well before a storm approaches and not wait until a storm advisory or warning has been declared, when it may be too late for you to be accommodated.
