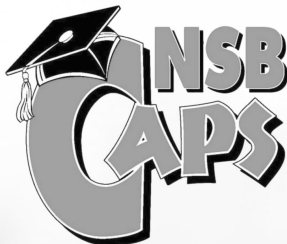

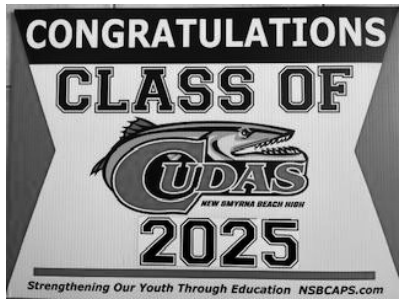
Finally, we plan to continue our Cuda Achievers Award program. Please visit our website to view requirements and feel free to nominate someone you fill fits the CUDA mold.

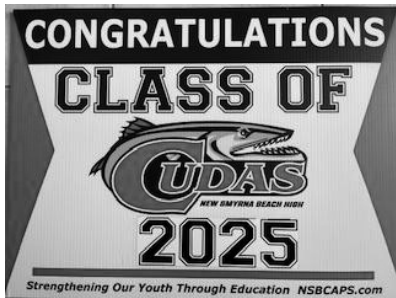
NSB CAPS is looking for community and alumni volunteers and board members.
