
Shore Power Electrical Issues By PC Al Heerensperger

After the Memorial Day raft up Karen & I went into Poulsbo to get a slip for the next day. We tied up and plugged in, no problem. Shortly after a couple in a 42 Grand Banks came in. I helped them tie up but when he tried to plug his cord in the breaker tripped. We tried other pedestals, nothing worked. I had him disconnect his cord at the boat, the breaker held. I told him he has a problem in the boat. Later member Tom Youngs came in, he had the same issue. I noticed the Marina had put in GFČI breakers. I know there has been some talk about stray electrical currents entering the water, creating a dangerous condition. After we got home I did some research and found some good articles on the subject in PassageMaker Magazine and Boat U.S. Magazine. I contacted both and they us permission to pass the info on aave to the membership.

There are a lot of things that can cause the problem but the biggest one is inverters and generators. Also remember to check the boat end of your power cord, some of these are plugged in all the time. Corrosion can build up on the prongs and cause problems. So plugging and unplugging often will clean the corrosion off. Between the two magazines there is a lot of info on this issue. Use the links provided to read about it.


