**Point #1 – Legitimate Problems: What are the documented problems received by Code Enforcement? I truly do not know! The Citizen’s Committee filed a Public Records Request on Jan. 26th to more fully understand the nature and scope of the RV complaints. We were denied that information in that “the computer wasn’t set up to sort for RV Complaints”. We believe we all...Supervisors and RVers...have the legal right to know this information. How else do we address the issues related to guest housing? We would appreciate Code Enforcement reconsidering our request. Yes...I can only imagine the tremendous challenge and complexity for Code Enforcement to deal with complaints. Obviously not everyone will see issues the same! I do know the system for anonymous complaints promotes false suspicions in a neighborhood; the option to be anonymous also seems to bring out the serial complainers...same person/multiple complaints. We know that many complainers (at least in AZ City) are NOT impacted neighbors...literally just someone driving by. How many complaints are truly valid? I am concerned that the proposal for short term guest RV code deals with real problems and yet avoids undue impact on an RV friendly community!**

**Point #2 – Being RV Friendly: Many of us bought a home in a specific location only because we were told this was an RV friendly area. Arizona Department of Tourism indicates in 2014 Pinal county tourism reaped over \$600 million dollars and impacted over 5800 jobs. We believe snowbirds and RVers greatly impact those numbers. Be aware...word of Anti-RV policies spreads quickly in today’s cyber world!**

**What is being RV friendly? It is simply having code so that law abiding residents can store their own RV on their property and can welcome RV guests who come through the area. Allow these friends and family to visit for a few days. They will definitely share their finances in our community restaurants and other businesses!**

**I ask you to review our Citizen’s Group draft. Set-backs, sewer systems, water usage, etc. are addressed without negative consequence for the entire Pinal County. There are Common Sense solutions.**

**The bottom line is....being RV friendly attracts good law abiding citizens that are a real asset to their communities. They keep their properties and their community well maintained. They add many dollars to the local businesses and taxes coming into our county coffers.**
