Dear Parents:

Good morning parents, first, thank you for allowing your children/youth to participate in the youth ministries at Union Chapel. It isn't always easy to direct our children to church events and groups that we know will be good for them, sometimes they push back, so again, thank you.

I wanted to take a much needed opportunity to address some new things on the horizon for our youth at Union Chapel and to correct some misinformation that seems to have been shared among some of our parents. As always, I encourage you to balance information shared that raises questions and concerns with me. I am at virtually all meetings, a part of virtually all discussions with committee leaders, and I am usually the best source at clarifying in formation that may trouble you. And I welcome those calls, emails, texts and conversations, always.

First some clarification. It was reported to me that some of our parents were told that there "is no funding for the youth group." In reality, our Finance Committee and the Church Council actually doubled the amount of funds available for youth and children's ministries, from \$3,000 in 2019 to \$6,000 in 2020. Why? Because we didn't want the youth spending their time doing a lot of fund raising, but rather enjoying and participating in events that build faith and maturity. While it is true Union Chapel determined, after many meetings and discussion by several committees, we could no longer financially afford to fund the salary of a youth leader(s), our funding for the actual youth ministries has doubled. Also, our youth l eadership has actually grown, not diminished. Reidonna King and Debbie Melson continue to help plan, implement, and give leadership to the youth program. In a ddition to those great ladies, myself, Jill, Kevin and Christy Duckwall, and Jim & Jeri Mahan have all been attending, planning, and overseeing the Cooperative Youth Group meetings and upcoming events. So our youth leadership has actually grown. Lastly, I know Reidonna is already looking into a summer "big" event for our youth. While plans have not yet been made, I know a quality big event for them will happen once again. All of this, I believe, is very good news for our youth program. So please, share the good news with others joining us and praying for this huge and exciting undertaking!

Children's Ministry at Union Chapel. Within the next couple of weeks Becky Miller and I will begin laying the groundwork for a mid-week ministry to children ages K through 6th grade. We hope to work with the Morgan County School system in bringing (busing) those children to Union Chapel, once a week, in order to provide a safe place to learn about Jesus and his love, eat a nutritious snack, build relationships, help with homework and build relationships with families in our community. We will need many helpers, I hope you will consider

Youth Ministry at Union Chapel. In December of 2019, we began a discussion with other churches about supplementing each local church youth program with a gathering of youth groups once a month and naming it the Cooperative Youth Ministry Group. Since that time roughly 15 adults and young people have been praying, planning, organizing, and now this Sunday, January 26th at 6pm, will be our first event at The Blue, in Berkeley Springs, WV. Remember The Blue is a facility owned and operated by First UMC and built and designed just for youth! Inside is a facility to gather, play music, watch movies, play pool, ping pong, foosball, "gaming," full kitchen, rest rooms and even an outdoor pavilion and classrooms. Wow. We have heard feedback from our youth that when they gather with other youth, "it is fun and exciting." We are excited about this new opportunity not only for our youth, but all who join us. The Cooperative Youth Group will only supplement what we are doing locally with our youth at Union Chapel. Reidonna has been busy planning those Union Chapel events.

As always parents, we need your support, involvement, your prayers, and your help in order for these ministries to be a success. The first line of discipleship to our children is always parents. Union Chapel is there to help provide a way of doing that, along with you, as partners with you, as we all seek to provide safe and good and fun ways of becoming and growing in discipleship. Remember, those who are providing leadership to these programs are doing so on a volunteer basis; their time, energies, resources, concern and care, given to our young people. It is important to thank them and encourage them for their great work. Too often it becomes easy to simply criticize. So again, thank you for all you do and will do, and thank you in advance for seeking me out for clarification on matters concerning youth funding and leadership. Blessings,

Be Prepared to Stay Safe and Healthy in Winter

Winter storms and cold temperatures can be dangerous. Stay safe and healthy by planning ahead. Prepare your home and cars. Prepare for power outages and outdoor activity. Check on older adults.

Although winter comes as no surprise, many of us may not be ready for its arrival. If you are prepared for the hazards of winter, you are more likely to stay safe and healthy when temperatures start to fall.

Take These Steps for Your Home

Staying inside is no guarantee of safety. Take these steps to keep your home safe and warm during the winter months.

Winterize your home.

- Install weather stripping, insulation, and storm windows.
- Insulate water lines that run along exterior walls.
- Clean out gutters and repair roof leaks.

Check your heating systems.

- Have your heating system serviced professionally to make sure that it is clean,
- working properly, and ventilated to the outside.
- Inspect and clean fireplaces and chimneys.
- If you do not have a working smoke detector, install one. Test batteries monthly and
- replace them twice a year.
- Have a safe alternate heating source and alternate fuels available.
- Prevent carbon monoxide (CO) emergencies.
- Install a CO detector to alert you of the presence of the deadly, odorless, colorless gas. Check batteries when you change your clocks in the fall and spring.
- Learn symptoms of CO poisoning: headache, dizziness, weakness,
- upset stomach, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion.

Take These Precautions Outdoors

Outdoor activities can expose you to several safety hazards, but you can take these steps to prepare for them:

- Wear appropriate outdoor clothing: wear a tightly woven, preferably wind-resistant coat or jacket; inner layers of light, warm clothing; mittens; hats; scarves; and waterproof boots.
- Sprinkle cat litter or sand on icy patches.
- Learn safety precautions to follow when outdoors.
- Work slowly when doing outside chores.
- Take a buddy and an emergency kit when you are participating in outdoor recreation.
- Carry a cell phone.




