

Stewardship & Finance Committee Report

Within the next month, we will complete the first 6 months of our church's fiscal year. To provide you with a current picture of our financial position, the information provided below is current as of May 27th. Comparing our finances to last year for the same time period reveals some positive results. Both weekly givings and various fundraisers are ahead of last year however donations to our special canvass objective lags behind at this time. Overall expenses are being carefully managed. As a result, to date the overall shortfall is only \$3,335.00 which is \$2,286.00 better than for the same time frame in 2024. However I should remind everyone that July and August is fast approaching and historically results in lower revenues being received. I will also remind you that the church's expenses do not stop so your continued support is needed to get us through until September when attendance and revenues normally improve. Enjoy your summer and stay healthy.

The M&P Committee brought forward recommendations to the May 6 Board meeting which were approved. church is exactly where I'll be reminded of my spiritual needs and how the rest of my worldly responsibilities are of lesser importance.

For those who are unable attend in person, our weekly online worship video is the next best thing, a way to share in the experience as part of our broader congregation. Our connections within Erie Street United provide an immeasurable sense of belonging and support. As part of our family of faith, we receive God's inspiration and guidance (through scripture, music, and Rev Lynne's messages), and we lift each other up through prayer and fellowship. When it comes to supporting one another, Rev Lynne may just appear to be the one overseeing the process, but in fact, she is part of the circle. Just as she is there for us in our challenging times, we are there for her when she needs support. When she recently lost her mother, we shared her pain. Even though she was miles away, she was in our thoughts and prayers. We are pleased that she is now back with us in Ridgetown (but the thoughts

and prayers will continue).
That collective support is part
of being a member of our
church family.

Unfortunately, outside of our faith community, there appears to be a growing need for mental health support. There are 1-800 help lines, online resources, printed materials, professional counselling, etc., all intended to provide solutions for the stress of life. Is life these days so much harder than in days gone by? Or is our society just different now? My guess is that (to at least some extent) it's because fewer people believe in God, fewer people attend church, so it's more difficult for them to have hope. By contrast, as Christians, we know our lives are part of a greater plan, a plan where good triumphs over evil, sins are forgiven, and our faith in Jesus is rewarded with eternal life with God in heaven. So, if you encounter someone in your life who is run ragged by the pace of everyday life or who has lost their sense of hope, ask them if they'd ever consider trying "church". It's effective and rewarding, and there's definitely a place for them at Erie Street United Church. <


