SPECIAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Approximately 25 LWCA members met at the Franz's home on September 29, 2018 for a Special Membership Meeting. The Annual Membership Picnic was cancelled due to bad weather; therefore, the election of the officers did not take place at the scheduled election date and time. The membership present voted to not reschedule the annual membership picnic. The main purpose of this Special Membership Meeting was to elect officers for the upcoming term of 2019-2020. Jerry Webster, Pam Skripsky, Patti Erwin, and Yvana Franz were chosen by President Bill Franz as tellers to count the votes. The election yielded the following results:

The present membership voted to have the newly elected officers to immediately take their offices with the exception of the treasurer who would take charge after the LWCA audit that would be as soon as possible. This would change the terms of the officers from starting in January 2019 to September 2018. UPDATE ON RECLAIMED WATER PROJECT

The reclaimed water project will pump treated effluent into Lake Weatherford helping to reduce the need to pump water into the lake from Lake Benbrook in times of draught or heavy usage. Currently our treated effluent is discharged to Lake Benbrook. As it is now, we pay to pump our own water back to us. Weatherford is entitled to a certain amount of water from Benbrook free but for the cost of pumping. An actual cost for the water kicks in above a certain quantity each year. Water we can reclaim when this pipeline is online will benefit the city's bottom line (When capital improvements are paid for), will add stability to our water supply, and, to some extent, moderate our water level fluctuations.

This project has been slow to get off the drawing board. This rate of progress is pretty typical for projects involving various government entities and laborious permitting processes. Rick Shaffer, Director of Water Utilities for the city gave a report to the Utility Board at their August 30th meeting about the progress of the permitting and design phases. Why does it take so long? There is the water rights permit, the environmental permit, the discharge permit, the Corps of Engineers ok, easement properties to buy, and so forth. According to Mr. Shaffer, we are still only in the design phase but construction should start in the next few years!


