Membership Increase: We are pleased to report that the New Smyrna Beach Garden Club has inducted 24 new members this year. The increase from January to December is from 124to 129 for a total of 5 new members. We sadly lost 19 members primarily due to issues such as aging or relocation, as is common in most clubs. We welcome new members to our Club, but are sad to say good bye to friends who have been with us for several years. Our involvement in the community has helped bring recognition, and we maintain a website, http://www.newsmyrnabeachgardenclub.org/ and Facebook page to provide information on our club and an update on our activities. Our local newspaper provides publicity concerning our fundraising events and activities, and publishes a notice of our monthly meeting. Our meetings and workshops are open to everyone. Our own members invite friends to our meetings, who often join our Club after realizing all the activities in which they can participate.

Communications: The New Smyrna Beach Garden Club members receive a monthly newsletter by email. For those without a computer, a member "buddy" provides a printed copy. Our newsletter," Growing Coastal", provides information on our committee activities, the Garden of the Month selection, upcoming events, and reminders for Food Pantry and Pet food and supplies donations. We also maintain a Website and Facebook page which is always updated. The Sunshine Chair sends sympathy and get well cards when needed. Each month when new members are inducted, a short biography is read, followed by an opportunity for each new member to speak about themselves. Their picture, biography, and contact information is also included in the newsletter. Our membership application form asks prospective members about their interests, and committee chairs contact them to become involved in club activities. Each new member at the time of induction receives a small loose leaf binder which serves as a Handbook. It contains pertinent information about our Club, including programs for the year and members 'names, addresses, email addresses, and phone numbers. This section is updated annually and then distributed each year to all members.

Club Representation: The average number of members attending meetings: General business meetings 75-80, District meetings 10-12, FFGC Convention 9-12, Deep South 2, and National Convention 1.

Club Finances: Our Garden Club dues each year are used for maintenance of the Clubhouse and grounds, insurance, and utilities. Our fundraisers provide financial support for our projects and services, such as High School Academic Scholarship, Camp Wekiva and SEEK scholarships, and FFA donations. Maintaining our Clubhouse can be costly some years when unexpected repairs are needed that are not in our budget. Often members will donate the funds necessary. Our grounds are maintained by our volunteer Flower Power team, and spouses have also been recruited for various repairs.
