Happy Trails





Let's talk about something different this month. Living in east Tennessee we've all become used to the pop-up thunderstorms that occur in the afternoon when the temperatures rise in to the 90's. Many of us just find a covered area, strap on our rain suits and move on, right? Well, there's been a long time myth that being on or in a vehicle with rubber tires insulates the occupants from lightning strikes. Not so fast grasshopper! Cars and trucks provide some protection from lightning strikes, but that happens due to the metal bodywork that diverts the electrical current to the ground, NOT that the tires offer any protection. The car / truck occupants are usually in contact with fabric or plastic parts in the vehicle which insulates them in the vehicle, unless they are actually touching metal parts which can cause problems.


Vehicles like convertibles and MOTORCYCLES that are not fully enclosed in metal are dangerous to operate in conditions where lightning is likely to occur. If lightning strikes an open top vehicle the electrical current can connect directly with its occupants, especially if the occupants' heads extend above the top of the vehicle. This is rare, but two motorcyclists were killed by lightning strikes in Colorado in recent times.


If you're riding and see lightning your bet bet is to find an underpass or a parking structure to wait out the storm, but don't park under a tree. Trees attract lightning, due to their height and moisture content and can transmit the electrical charge to you. Also branches and the trunk of the tree will split when they are struck which can fall on you causing serious injury or death. I'll expand on this subject at our June meeting.

I will also have the tickets at the meeting for our upcoming outing to the Smokies ball-game on Friday June 7th. As usual, those who would like to ride as a group to the game, we'll meet at the Cracker Barrel parking lot on I-40 exit 398 at 5PM and ride to the park at 5:30PM. Remember that parking is still \$5 per vehicle, and rain postponement is decided by the ballpark management after the scheduled 7PM starting time.

Explanation of the GWRRA Rider Education Levels Program...

The GWRRA Rider Education Program (REP) is intended to make the motorcycle environment safer by reducing injuries and fatalities and increasing motorcyclist skills and awareness. The REP does not propose to have all the answers. However, our close-working relationship with the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), as well as additional GWRRA programs and studies, has provided a wealth of information for use in establishing a comprehensive Rider Education Program. Through Commitment, Education and Application, we can reduce our accident rate significantly. Listed below are several benefits of a fully implemented GWRRA Rider Education Program at the Chapter level:

- Increased rider knowledge
- Increased rider safety skills
- Prevention of accidents
- Reduced injuries
- Reduced fatalities
- Improved general public image of motorcyclists
- Enhanced enjoyment of motorcycle riding
 The motorcycle community is already realizing many positive benefits from the
 GWRRA Rider Education Program. Through the efforts of the Rider Education Offic ers and participation of the membership and others, we will reach our goal of es tablishing the safest motorcycle environment possible.

One of the safety programs that GWRRA and our District is asking everyone to look at is the Riders Education Program and to be specific the level's Program. There are four levels to the program and each level is geared to make you a better rider and co-rider. Level 1 is as simple as saying that you are committing to riding safe then filling out the paper work and submitting it to our District Educator. I have just filled mine out and submitted it and look forward to working my way up through the other levels. I will have a members list at the meeting that will show where your current status is at and will have some forms for those wanting to get started. You can also go on the national web site and see your own status info that GWRRA has on you. To see it go to GWRRA (http://gwrra.org/) and click on the officer's tab and click on Rider Education. From here you can click on the levels program tab on the left side to read all about it or also on the left side click on My RE. Information then log in, your login name will be your membership number and your password will be the numbers of you address plus the expiration date on your membership card so for example if you address was 230 and you expiration date was 5/19 then your password would be 2300519. Once in you can see your GWRRA information, it's that simple. Hopefully everyone will join me and let's have some fun getting through other levels to make our favorite pass time a safe one.



Honda Goldwings 2001-2017 like all motorcycles have to have forks serviced. When doing this it is necessary to replace seals and **bushings** due to the angle and pressure the forks are constantly under as a result it wares the bushings and damages the seals. As the motorcycles age the front springs weaken and you will notice the bike sagging in front. A company called Progressive Suspensions has a solution Upgraded rear springs are also available.
