Day Cloudland Canyon Trippin' Cloudland Canyon **State Park**

Georgia

It's still cool enough for a jacket as I climb on the trike and point it toward the rising sun. Last night I loaded the trailer with all the supplies I need for 2 nights of tent camping in the northwest Georgia mountains. I am heading into unknown territory, roads that before were only lines on a map, as I make my way to Cloudland Canyon State Park. There are quicker routes that I could take, but I am on a quest to see parts of Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia that I have not seen before, areas that you just can't see if you go by the fast roads. So, I stick to the back roads. These byways meander through the rural countryside and small villages that have no traffic lights. Abandoned buildings tell the tale of broken dreams. Yard sales are plentiful as people try to turn their own junk into someone else's treasure. Barns in ill repair with old tractors worn from use are reminders of a bygone era. Every road and town has its own story to tell.




The sun finally peeks through a hole in the overcast sky to highlight rusty spots on the mountains where hints of fall are beginning to show. Traffic is almost non-existent as the road begins its serpentine path up the side of the mountain through a series of hairpin turns. It's shady and cool under the canopy of leaves.



On my right is the sign for Foster Falls, so I pull off to explore. It is only about a quarter mile to the base of the falls, but that hike is down a very steep, rugged trail made up of a jumble of large rocks. I am disappointed that there is hardly any water coming over the falls. The shady pool below it, however, is cool and refreshing. I clamber my way back up the rocks and continue on my journey.

The road winds its way back down the mountain and before long I am crossing beautiful Nickajack Lake. Just before I

get to the Alabama state line, the road goes through a series of back and forth curves, one coming immediately on the heels of the previous one, a fun ride. Each state has to have its own highway designations, so at the state line I find myself on a different road number. I cut the corner of Alabama and then enter Georgia where I find highway 136 that takes me through Trenton, up the mountain by way of a series of switchbacks, and to my home for the next couple of nights - Cloudland Canyon State Park.

Cloudland Canyon is located on the western edge of Lookout Mountain and is one of the largest and most scenic parks in Georgia. It is home to 1000 foot deep canyons, sandstone cliffs and waterfalls. There are plenty of hiking and mountain bike trails. For overnight accommodations they have cottages, yurts, and

several different types of camping and backpacking options. My choice is to tent camp in the West Rim Campground.

After setting up camp, I decide to do some exploring. Access to the West Rim Trail is not far from my campsite. The trail starts out fairly level, but before long it begins a steep descent down into the canyon. A wooden bridge crosses Daniel Creek and the path starts the climb up the opposite side. A little further along I see a sign pointing to the Waterfalls Trail. I want to see the falls, but I


don't realize what I am getting myself into. I take the left branch of the trail and navigate the steep terrain down to the base of Cherokee Falls. There is very little water coming over it, so I retraced my steps and then take the right trail to Hemlock Falls. This is where it gets interesting.



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When I start the waterfall portion of this hike I failed to read the part that said it is a strenuous 2 mile round trip down a 40 degree slope with 600 stairs! Not knowing this, I take the stairs and make it down to the falls. It's beautiful, but again, there is no water over the falls. Now, I have those look out over the 600 stairs to climb to get back to the trail that will take me back to my campsite. I am definitely feel- the Tennessee ing the burn by the time I make it to the top of the stairs and I still have another mile to go to get back to camp. I keep telling myself that all I have to do is just put one foot in front of the other.



I made it! I'm going to sleep good tonight!

After that good night sleep and a breakfast of oatmeal, bacon and strong black coffee, I prepare for my day's adventure. Point Park is located at the northern end of Lookout Mountain just south of Chattanooga. It is part of the Chickamauga-Chattanooga National Military Park. The grounds commemorate the "Battle Above the Clouds" that was fought on Lookout Mountain in

1863. The entryway to the park is modeled after the Corps of Engineers insignia. Cannons panoramic view of River and the city of Chattanooga. I try to imagine what this area would have looked like, and what it would have been like to be a



Confederate soldier behind those cannons watching the advancing Union army far below, knowing that we had only 1200 men to their 12,000.

The 85' high New York Peace Monument looks out into the hazy distance. On top of it are a Confederate and a Federal soldier shaking hands within view of seven states that were ravaged by the war.

Retracing my route back to Cloudland I stop at the Trading Post Smokehouse for some BBQ for



lunch. I just can't resist the aroma! It meets my expectations. I learn from the waitress that I am not far from where I had gone hang gliding a couple years ago. I get back on 136 and make a right on Hwy 189. In about 7 miles I reach the conditions to be just right for them to run off the ramp into the nothingness below and float around on the thermals in the clear blue sky like a big hawk. I reminisce of the thrill I had of the bird's eye view of the forested valley far beneath as I silently glided along the edge of the cliffs with the warm sun on my sail.



Back at the park I hike the Main Overlook Trail that runs along the edge of the canyon. The views of the deep canyon with its sheer sides and rocky rim are spectacular. After the walk I ride back to camp and put water on to boil for my dehydrated beef stew and a cup of coffee. The people here before me were kind enough to leave some wood. Between that and what I scrounge from the woods around my tent, I have enough fuel for a nice fire. After supper I start it up and sit back relaxing in its glow. As I stare into the flames, I reflect on how blessed I am to be able to have this adventure. The sun is setting, the fire is dying down, and the night symphony begins. It's time to call it a day and hit the sack.

After breakfast I break camp and pack the trailer. It's time to head toward home. I back track my

route to Jasper, TN and take Hwy 28 to Dunlap and then Hwy 127 to Pikeville. Instead of continuing on 127 into Crossville, I turn off onto Hwy 209, East Valley Road that runs through the lush farmland closer to the mountains. The scenery is spot. Several gliders are getting set up waiting for absolutely gorgeous! The rolling hills of the valley snuggle up to the very edge of the steep mountains. Cattle lie in the shade of big leafy trees contentedly chewing their cuds. Horses stand behind the fence at the edge of the road lazily watching as I ride by. The road has been good so far, but the closer I get to the head of the valley the worse it gets to the point that I am thankful to

be on 3 wheels instead of 2. tunately, when I finally reach the top of the mountain the road improves dramatically. Old Hwy 28 merges with Hwy 127 in Linary and takes me to Crossville where Hwy 70 leads me the last 100 miles back home.

The last 3 days have been an awesome time of adventure and exploring the beauty and wonders of God's creation. The diversity of the landscape with its array of color, sounds, and aromas mean there is never a dull moment. I

strive to keep my eyes open and stay alert at all times because I never know what will be around the next bend in the road!

Hi everyone,




