
Who can believe that October is just around the corner!! We hope that everyone has a lot of treats this month, and very few tricks!!

# October message from your District Educator

Here it is fall riding season again. Usually great weather to ride. Some plan fall foliage viewing trips this time of year. Some things to think about.

- ⇒ Watch for leaves covering the roadway.
- ⇒ If wet watch those yellow lines on those curvy roads.
- ⇒ Be sure and bring some warm clothing, it may be warm to start but turn cold especially in the mountains.
- ⇒ Be on the lookout for animals, deer, bear, possum's etc. they are active this time of the year.

Just a reminder about the ARC and TRC rider courses set in Manchester for October 5. The Application is on the Group Works and also sent out to all the Chapter Directors. We have slots open. Give me a call or contact Dennis Greer. There is an application included in the newsletter.

Last month we announced a new position of Chapter Skill Enhancement Advisor (CSEA). So far I have only had one chapter contact me about putting someone in this position. The role of the CSEA is to proactively support Member/ participant by providing them with information they can consider on their way to becoming skilled, prepared and safer riders and co-riders.

#### Encourage Responsibilities

- 1. Serve as an example by actively engaged in levels program. I plan to work with them to keep up with training needed by each chapter member to keep their levels up to date.
- 2. Monthly, or as often as possible and weather permitting based on members interest, put on and on-bike skills day with skill practice, bike games for riders and co-riders.
- 3. Team with the Chapter Ride Coordinator to promote the importance of best riding practices at chapter gathering, rides and events.
- 4. Utilize the quarterly chapter levels reports provided by the District Educator to support the members and assist them in achieving milestones and earning recognition.
- 5. Communicate directly with the District Educator to advocate for classes and courses to serve any chapter participant with an interest in progressing in the levels program, becoming a more proficient rider and being better prepared to respond to emergency situation

Qualifications and Skills The Chapter Skill Enhancement Advisor:

Is not an officer, and the position is not mandatory. They must have a basic knowledge of the GWRRA Rider Education Program. Is appointed by the Chapter Director. In interviewed by the District Director. Completes a Confidentiality Agreement. Is current Level II rider or Co-rider. Receives guidance and support from the District Educator. Communicates with the District Educator directly, keeping the Chapter Director in the loop to assure the needs of the chapter participants are met. Remember, the Chapter Skill Enhancement Adviser is an active participant on the Chapter staff and primary directions comes from the Chapter Director. Does not have Access to the Rider Education data base and relies on the District Educator for information. Each member of the District Rider Education staff will help each chapter and member to get the training needed to keep up their levels and to become better and safer riders. Beside Patti and myself, we have Roger and Marie Crowe, also Charlie and Pam Huffman with Medic First Aid. Feel free to contact us.

## 2019 Financial Register and Report

Chapter Directors and Treasurers, we are closing in on the end of the calendar year, so now is a good time to take stock of your financial situation to ensure everything is on track for the soon to come end of the year fiscal reports.

Chapter Treasurers are tasked with keeping up with chapter finances on a day-to-day basis. However, Chapter Directors, you are accountable for the maintenance of operating funds and must ensure that clear, accurate records are kept of income and disbursements, and that all receipts are retained. Yours is the primary responsibility to make sure everything is, and remains in, good order.

Chapter Directors, it is also incumbent upon you to ensure that your Treasurer is doing their job, and is up to the task. The Treasurer's job is not always easy, and it is human nature to need help but sometimes not ask for it. You need to find out how your Treasurer is doing with the maintenance of your financial records and get in there to help if needed. And you can only help by checking with your Treasurer regularly. You should, at a bare minimum, be reviewing your financial status on a monthly basis. Asking "how's it going" doesn't work – you need to get your hands on your records and take a look. And *not* on December 31st.

Ask your Treasurers if they are comfortable with how to complete the required reports. If not, again, now is the time to help them understand exactly what they need to do to stay up with the records.

Chapter Treasurers – do not be afraid to ask questions, of your Chapter Directors or myself. It is incumbent upon you to ensure your Chapter Director reviews chapter finances on a monthly basis. How you do that is up to you. Each month, you should be reconciling the chapter's monthly bank statement to the "2019 Transaction Record" worksheet of the GWRRA Financial Register and Report workbook. Upon reconciling each month, a copy of the workbook should be transmitted to your Chapter Director for review.

All transactions must be recorded on the GWRRA Financial Register and Report workbook for end of the year submission to the District Director. The workbook is available on the GWRRA National website page under "Officer Resources" (<a href="http://gwrra.org/oconnect/officerresources.html">http://gwrra.org/oconnect/officerresources.html</a>), then under the "Finance/Information Page" section. Just click on the "XLS" of the "2019 Financial Register and Report (XLS)" line.

Chapter Directors and Treasurers, I cannot emphasize strongly enough that should any of you have any questions at all about the 2019 Financial Register and Report workbook, or need help understanding what needs to be done, please never hesitate to contact me at <a href="mailto:thunderchief452@yahoo.com">thunderchief452@yahoo.com</a> or call me at (865) 376-5090. 

# Ride to the Race at Bristol Motor Speedway

Is your chapter looking for something a bit different in a fall ride? Why not ride to Bristol for the Bandit Big Rig Series Race on Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup>? A lot of GWRRA members are truckers and/or enjoy racing. Combine that with a ride to a family friendly Big Rig Race and you have a great way to spend a fall day!

Two years ago we had a couple Rides to the Races at Highland Rim Speedway, and many have been asking when the truck races would be back in the area... well here it is.



This is the final race of the 2019 season for the Big Rig Series, so trophies will be awarded for the race winners and also for the season points champions. This means the trucks will be racing all out, nothing held back!

Bristol Motor Speedway is known for its extreme banking that allows for exceptionally fast speeds. (One race truck has already clocked 140 mph in a demo race. Yes, it was my son Mike Morgan in #88.)

The day-long event starts with the Fan Series Truck Show; if you drive a big rig shine it up and enter. The fan favorite serves as the pace truck.

The Bandit Meet & Greet at 1:30 allows all the fans onto the track to inspect the race trucks, meet the drivers, and collect autographs. Kids are often allowed to sit on the trucks for a photo with their favorite driver.

Racing begins at 3:30 with three 10-lap Heat Races. This is followed by the Bandit Shoot Out where two trucks race one lap; the winner races the next challenger; that winner races the next challenger, and so on until the last winner. Golden tickets are handed out to a selection of kids; each ticket has the number of a race truck. Whichever kid is holding the tick-

et for the Shoot Out winner receives a \$100 bill. All kids participating receive a Bandit t-shirt.

Two 15-lap Challenge Races are then run, and that is followed by the Main Race where all race trucks still drivable race for a \$10,000 check that is handed to the winner. Lots of bumpin', rubbin', spins and down-right crashes are typical. It makes for a wild race.
