Typically, February has never been a good month for riding, so I now have a good opportunity to go back to a topic that not only pertains to riding, but driving as well, DISTRACTED DRIVING! The modern roadway free-for-all is a combination of sensory overload; driver distractions; outdated and decaying infrastructure; population explosion; unfunded driver training; lax requirements for licensing; and no requirement for recurrent training.

Everyone operating a vehicle should want to be the best they can at a task that is very unforgiving. Unfortunately, this isn't so. The biggest mistake drivers make is sensory overload. Distractions have existed forever, but examples while driving include tuning the radio, eating, having a conversation, disciplining children and applying makeup.

We have all seen, maybe even participated in, many more than these examples, but the biggest problem is the mass addiction of connected smartphones. Supercomputers have been miniaturized to several square inches and can now be carried around in a pocket. I have yet to find answering the phone or texting while driving to be more important than my own safety, or that of others.

We can't do much to protect ourselves against selfish drivers. However, there are some things we can do to identify those drivers and stay away from them. A stopped vehicle that doesn't move when the light turns green likely has a driver who is busy on the phone. Likewise, a driver with their eyes or head looking down is a good bet that they are busy texting. A vehicle on the freeway easing along at 60 mph, with traffic backing up behind them, is another indication that they are focused elsewhere. (NOT to be confused with drivers from certain regions of the country who are natural lane hogs)

Mentally note the license plate number, the color and make of the car, get past the obstruction and on with your business. It will do no good to point out the error of other people's judgement. Selfish drivers take this as an affront, which is how road rage begins. If you drive the same route on a regular basis, remember and avoid these drivers.

Motorcyclists equipped with Bluetooth technology connected to their phones should be very selective about how they use it. Even though it is "hands free", talking on the phone increases risk in any environment that requires absolute attention, like riding a motorcycle. Even listening to music is a potential distraction, which can reduce your reaction time to potential conflicts. Let calls go to voicemail or pull over before answering if possible.

Catastrophic results occur every day due to people driving distracted. It is not worth the risk of getting hurt or killed, damaging your vehicle or getting arrested for the instant gratification of communication. It can wait!

# Cabin in the Smokies

Brakes



Technically brake fluid can't freeze solid like water due to the fact that it is an oil. But it can reach a point where it becomes so thick that it no longer becomes effective at transferring force from the master cylinder to the wheels. The fluid can "gel" or congeal. Base mineral oil has a "working point" of -22C or -30F. But, it will never turn into a solid.

Additives to the base oil can push the limit to -45F or lower. If the temperatures go lower, chances are the pedal will be stiff, but not frozen. After a few stops, the heat of the brakes would warm the fluid. If you are driving in temperatures below -50F, you have a lot more problems than the brake fluid like engine oil and coolant. Theoretically, the ABS pump on some vehicles could have problems if it activates and the brake fluid is thick enough. This could introduce air bubbles into the brake fluid. Also, since brake fluid is hydroscopic (absorbs water), the additional water can influence the viscosity at lower temperatures.

No, DOT 3,4 and 5.1 brake fluid will not freeze preventing you from stopping altogether. Chances are if you have experienced a hard brake pedal in the winter, it is condensation in the brake booster or vacuum supply hose that has frozen. Honda recommends DOT 4 brake fluid, and the industry as a whole recommends replacing brake fluid every 3 years.


