What kind of God do you believe in?

Jim McGuiggan wrote in his book *The God of the Towel*, “A God who tears mountain ranges to shreds, who rolls out light years of space like a man laying carpet, a God who flings galaxies into the empty space and lays oceans in their places with an eyedropper – that kind of God, we think earns the name ‘God.’”

Undoubtedly, a God of such power deserves our worship. However; we have deeper reason for reverence to Him.

In John 20:27, Jesus said to Thomas, “Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe.” In verse 28 Thomas proclaimed, “My Lord and my God!” At this moment, it wasn’t the omnipotence of God that compelled Thomas to confess. Thomas was floored by a kind of God unlike any other.

“A God who will be bundled into a crowded room, with spittle falling

from his beard and red welts marking his face? A God like that? A God who stands silent before an insolent and pathetic little Roman governor, a God who listens patiently to the rantings of an ecclesiastical hypocrite? A God like that? A God who blushes as he is stripped naked for crucifixion, who winces as pikes gouge their way into his feet and hands? A God who delivers himself into the hands of stupid, self-serving, brutal men – *this* is the God who stood before Thomas.” (Jim McGuiggan)

Our invulnerable God assumed vulnerability to prove his love for us. He is living, and his love is perfect. We could have no greater reason for reverence than that which he has given us. May we hold steadfast in love and belief of the one, true God.
