Who are the real life people in our congregation who come to mind when you read the following two passages?

1 Timothy 3:1-7

"The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. Therefore an overseer must be above reproach. the husband of one wife, sober-minded, selfcontrolled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil."

Titus 1:5-9

"This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you if anyone is above reproach, the husband of one wife, and his children are believers and not open to the charge of debauchery or insubordination. For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it." I hope that the first people who came to mind are the men who have served God and us together as elders, overseers, and shepherds for more than a decade: Bill, Glen, John, Rick and Wayne.

Now, will you read those two passages again, and think of other people in our congregation? Because those five men believe the time has come for our eldership to grow by the addition of others who are ready to serve.

Give some thought to other passages that tell something about the character and commission of the church's designated leaders, too: Acts 11:27-30, 14:23, 15:1-35, 16:1-5, 20:17-38, 21:17-26; Ephesians 4:11-16; Philippians 1:1; 1 Timothy 4:14, 5:17-22; Titus 1:10-16; Hebrews 13:7,17; James 5:14-16; 1 Peter 5:1-4; etc.—not to mention the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) and the qualities of any effective and fruitful Christian (2 Peter 1:5-7).

All through December pray and ponder the Scriptures and the people who make up this congregation. Before the month ends, you'll get a letter in the mail from the elders. It will include a form on which they want you to write the names of men whom you believe-in light of the Scriptures and their lifestyles-are outfitted to serve well as shepherds of this flock. On Sunday morning, December 29, all of our adult classes will study what the Bible says about the character required of overseers. That Sunday night our sermon will explore the commission God gives to elders. After that night, submit your recommendations to one of the present elders. They would like to collect all the recommendations by Sunday, January 12.


Bette Sinden is in Landmark Hospital in Joplin. Susie Tomlin is in Freeman West after breaking her leg.

her job in order to transport her mother to Tulsa for weekly cancer treatments. If you know someone who needs help, please contact Jennifer Daniels or Natalie McInturff.


Devo and Donuts is every Tuesday morning at 7:00 in the activities center. Come and bring your friends.
