In our weekly Bible reading we have finally come to the book of Revelation. We often wonder why this book is in the Bible. It is filled with signs, symbols, and images that are hard for us to understand. In our attempt to understand the symbolism, some have been lead to false conclusions. We need to have our conclusions harmonize with the rest of the Bible.

The grand theme of the book is that of a war and conflict between good and evil resulting in a victory for the righteous and defeat for the wicked. The book reveals the gigantic spiritual struggles between God and His forces and against Satan and his forces. Satan uses the Roman powers to back and support paganism and social worldliness, while God uses Christ to strengthen and lead his faithful saints and uses his righteous judgments to overcome and defeat Satan and his powers. It is a war to the death for one, and eternal victory for the others.

The purpose of the book is to reveal, through symbols, the nature and character of the great conflict between good and evil. The book is designed to give courage for Christians to remain faithful in the face of all opposition and persecution. Its message is not only for those to whom the book was written but to all who suffer as Christians in the future. The book gives comfort and assurance that in every spiritual and moral conflict, Christ gives victory to those who are steadfast in faith and life.

One key word used in the book is conquer or overcome, which is used some 17 times in the book. Rewards are on the basis of overcoming (Chap. 2,3), which is made possible by the power of God and the victory of Christ. The conquerors overcame, "because of the blood of the Lamb, and because of the word of their testimony. And they loved not their life even unto death" (12:11), and these that overcome shall inherit that which God has provided for the victors (21:7). Someone has said, "The revelation has all the appeal of a fairy story in which the bad dragon is beaten, and the beautiful lady is saved."

We now come to the key verse in the book. Revelation 17:14: "These shall war against the Lamb, and the Lamb shall overcome them, for he is Lord of Lords, and King of Kings; and they also shall overcome that are with him, called and chosen and faithful." The ten kings and the beast shall war against the Lamb and his forces. These kings and all opponents of the Lamb shall be defeated (19:19ff.).

This book pronounces a blessing on those who read it. "Blessed is he that readeth, and they that hear the words of the prophecy, and keep the things that are written therein, for the time is at hand" (1:3). Likewise there is a blessing for those who hear. Hearing means more than just listening to what is being said; it involves hearing with a view of doing. Jesus said, "if ye know these things, blessed are ye if ye do them" (John 13:17). James would say; "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deluding your own selves" (James 1:22).
