THE GRACE OF GOD

An Introductory Study

That 'the eyes of your understanding being enlightened that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places." Ephesians 1:18-20

The above passage was Paul's prayer for the church of Ephesus. He knew that a revelation of God's grace would be the greatest deterrent against sliding back into their old lifestyle. God's love when understood in all its dimensions will foster the utmost devotion in the hearts of the believers. Grace and knowledge are complimentary. When grace is not comprehended, it is easy to become like Esau who carelessly traded his birthright to satisfy his immediate carnal desire. The only real tragedy that can happen to a believer is to lose one's faith in God.

"Now Jacob cooked a stew: and Esau came in from the field, and he was weary. And Esau said to Jacob, "Please feed me with that same red stew, for I am weary," Therefore his name was called Edom. And Jacob said, "Sell me your birthright as of this day." And Esau said, "Look, I am about to die; so what is this birthright to me?" Then Jacob said, "Swear to me as of this day." So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob. And Jacob gave Esau bread and stew of lentils: then he ate and drank, arose, and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright." Genesis 25:29-34

"For it would have been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than having known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered to them. But it has happened to them according to the true proverb: 'A dog returns to his own vomit, and a sow, having washed, to her wallowing in the mire." II Peter 2:21,22

In this study we will attempt to trace God's love and grace from eternity past, to our present standing with Him, and then look through the glass into the glorious future prepared for God's people.

DEFINITIONS:

GRACE: It is translated from the Greek word, 'charis.' It indicates the divine influence upon the human heart, and its reflection in the life of the believer. It implies unmerited favor, a divine gratuity, endowment, or a miraculous faculty that is imparted. Grace always distinguishes the graced one as being favored or blessed spiritually. To further develop the definition, let's look at the words; influence and reflection.

INFLUENCE: the power to produce an effect without using force.

REFLECTION: a likeness or image.

Grace then is a work of God's premeditated love to bring about a godly effect upon the life of the believer. The Christian is God's own workmanship.

"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:10

"for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure."

Philippians 2:13

THE OLD TESTAMENT: A REVELATION OF GOD'S MERCY

The Old Testament is a contrast between God's holiness and man's depravity. Man with all his good intentions does not have the innate ability to be righteous. The history of Israel is one of repeated spiritual and political apostasies. The only redeeming factor of these two diametrically opposed natures was God's longsuffering and mercy. Notice the words of the prophet Jeremiah.

"Through the Lord's mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning, Great is Your faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22,23

THE NEW TESTAMENT: A REVELATION OF GOD'S GRACE

The same holy God of the Old Testament made a new covenant that enabled us, through the blood atonement of Jesus and the Holy Spirit's inward work, to walk in holiness before Him. The manifestation of His favor only becomes greater with the passing of time. We, the recipients of this grace, are on display before principalities and powers demonstrating just how good God is. Through Jesus we are more than conquerors. We are the sons of God. The church is in contrast to the great disappointments of natural Israel. She is spiritual Israel and well pleasing to the Lord.

"Of this salvation the prophets have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you, searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow. To them it was revealed that, not to themselves, but to us they were ministering the things which now have been reported to you through those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven-things which angels desire to look into." I Peter 1:10-12

GOD'S GRACE From the Beginning

God is eternal. He is before all things and knows all things. It is therefore in His power to predetermine the course of His own creation. It is evident from scriptures that He has established a plan by His infinite wisdom. He has determined to reveal His great kindness both now and in the ages to come.

Whether God has predestined the fate of every individual is a controversial matter that has no real merit. It would be easy to ignorantly blame our failures on Him for predestinating us to do so. We cannot shirk our moral responsibility. It should be understood that grace has been predetermined before the foundation of the earth upon a people God knew beforehand in Christ that would respond in faith to the Gospel. His foreknowledge does not forfeit our accountability to Him.

"For whom He foreknew He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren." Romans 8:29

"elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ, grace to you and peace be multiplied." I Peter 1:3

A predetermined grace would be bestowed upon a fore known people. These intended blessing would be spiritual in nature. They would include 1) a holy standing before God without any blame, 2) the rights as sons of God, 3) complete acceptance in the heavenlies through Christ, 4) redemption from all evil and loss, 5) access to forgiveness through the blood of Jesus, 6) wisdom of the ages, 7) a wonderful inheritance, 8) the Holy Spirit as a down payment of more to come.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the Beloved. In Him we have redemption through His blood the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace which He made to abound toward us in all wisdom and prudence, having made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He purposed in Himself, that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times He might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth-- in Him. In Him also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will, that we who first trusted in Christ should be to the praise of His glory. In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory. "Ephesians 1:3-14

Every grace would have Jesus as its source and center. He is the sole means by which grace and not just mercy could be imparted from a holy God to sinners. Truly grace came by Jesus. It is so complimentary to know that we have been thought of and planned for before we even existed. Let us continue on to know this most loving God.

THE GRACE OF GOD Revealed in Salvation

"For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men." Titus 2:11

Thanks to God's foreknowledge of our need, and His determined kindness to us who believe, our prayers for help are met with His provisions. Grace (intended and unmerited favor) sets in motion a real life changing salvation. It is a Great Salvation!"

"Grace is but glory begun, and glory is but grace perfected." (Jonathan Edward)

"And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others. But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which god prepared beforehand that we should walk in them. Therefore remember that you, once Gentiles in the flesh —who are called Uncircumcision by what is called the Circumcision made in the flesh by hands—that at that time you were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. Ephesians 2:1-13

OUR SITUATION; DEAD: No other word describes it better. In death there is a loss of senses and a great onslaught of corruption. Spiritual we were rotting carcasses insensitive and offensive to God. That's as bad as it gets. Since the word 'deader' has no significant meaning, we were all equally dead. Nothing short of a miracle could save us.

HIS GRACE: He raised us by His Word. We have been resurrected with Christ! Salvation is the greatest miracle ever.

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life. Most assuredly, I say to you, the hour is coming and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God; and those who hear will live. John 5:24, 25

"It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life." John 6:63

OUR SITUATION; BOUND BY SATAN:

We were following a predetermined course orchestrated by Satan. We were disobedient to the law of God and following our own fallen desires and inclinations.

HIS GRACE: He lifted us up and caused us to sit with Christ in heavenly places. We are out of Satan's reach even as the Christ, symbolized as a child in Revelation 12, was carried away into heaven. Spiritually we have been raptured and empowered to do His will and not our own.

"Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord, as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust." II Peter 1:2-4

"Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. OUR SITUATION: CHILDREN OF WRATH, WITHOUT CHRIST, ALIENS TO THE PROMISED BLESSING, WITHOUT HOPE AND WITHOUT GOD, AND NOT EVEN CLOSE TO SECURING SALVATION.

HIS GRACE: WE HAVE BEEN BROUGHT NEAR BY THE BLOOD OF CHRIST.

Grace reveals God's love described in Ephesians 2:4 as 'great love.' How much love does it take to save a soul? Only God can love that much. We now have a great calling.

"But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy." I Peter 2:9,10

OUR BOAST IS IN THE LORD:

Since the dead have no power to bring themselves out of the grave, neither could we have done anything to improve our spiritual state. Our works were useless. Salvation is entirely the work of God. There is no room for anyone to boast but in the Lord's mercy and grace. He is the author and finisher of our faith. Let us all declare that we have been saved by grace.

GRACE THROUGH THE NAME OF JESUS

"Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen" Galatians 6:18

Paul, the apostle, would usually begin and end his epistles by invoking the grace of Jesus Christ upon his intended audience. Please notice that it is not just a generic grace Paul refers to, but the grace that comes from the Lord Himself. He is the great fountainhead of all spiritual blessings. His life was full of grace or Divine favor. Particularly this was manifest at His baptism and transfiguration.

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. John bore witness of Him and cried out, saying, 'This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me is preferred before me, for He was before me.' And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace."

John 1:14-16

"When He had been baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold the heavens were opened to Him and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him. And suddenly a voice came from heaven, saying, 'This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.'"

Matthew 3:16,17

"And a cloud came and overshadowed them; and a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "this is My beloved Son, Hear Him!"

The name of God has great significance. It is never to be used flippantly. It represents His character and authority. The name given to the Only Begotten of the Father expressed His greatest empathy and power toward His people; JESUS: Jehovah is Salvation! Our Lord Jesus Christ was the anointed One to bear that happy name on our behalf.

"Save now, I pray, O Lord; O Lord, I pray, send now prosperity. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! We have blessed you from the house of the Lord, God is the Lord, And He has given us light; Bind the sacrifice with cords to the altar. You are my God, and I will praise You: You are my God, I will exalt You. Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever."

Psalms 118:25-29

"I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; If another comes in his own name, him you will receive." John 5:43

The name Jesus is not a magic word to be used as an incantation. It becomes a powerful tool only for those who know the Lord and have trusted Him as Lord and Savior. He gives the name its significance. People of the early church were known as those who called upon the name of the Lord. Great grace is solicited as we use that name in confident faith.

THE GRACE OF GIVING

The intent and culmination of grace is to impart a gift to another. Therefore for divine grace to even exist, it necessitates extravagant giving. Salvation is God's free gift. He is the Great Benefactor. One of the most rehearsed scriptures in the Bible says: "For God so loved the world that He GAVE His only begotten Son...." Grace requires sacrifice. Jesus exemplified this as no other has ever done.

"for you know the GRACE of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich." II Corinthians 8:9

The willingness and ability to give are gifts from God. We are naturally selfish. God's grace is often manifest among His people who are quite impoverished and yet very willing to share what they have with others. Such was the case with the Macedonian church. When they heard of the need in Judea among the Jews, they wanted to help. They were the recipients of the gospel which had originate from Jerusalem and they considered themselves debtors to the Jewish believers. Their generosity was extraordinary. What made it even more gracious was the fact that they were helping a people who had a tendency to look down on them. Love overcame the reasons why they should not help, and enabled them to do the Christ like thing.

"Moreover, brethren, we make known to you the GRACE of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia; that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality. For I bear witness that according to their ability, yes, and beyond their ability, they were freely willing, imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of the ministering to the saints. And not only as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God. So we urged Titus, that as he had begun, so he would also complete this GRACE in you as well. But as you abound in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all diligence, and in your love for us—see that you abound in this GRACE also." II Corinthians 8:1-7

PRINCIPLES OF CHRIST-LIKE GIVING:

- It should come from premeditated thought and planning. (a willing mind)
 "For if there is first a willing mind...." II Corinthians 8:12
 "So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity.."
 II Corinthians 9:7
- 2. Your giving should reflect what you have. It is possible to under give and to over give. "it is accepted according to what one has, and not according to what he does not have." II Corinthians 8:12
- 3. Giving should be done cheerfully. "for God loves a cheerful giver." II Corinthians 9:7

BENEFITS OF A LIFESTYLE OF GIVING:

- 1. You have a promise that you will reap bountifully. "But this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." II Corinthians 9:6
- 2. It will create a flow of good things coming into your life and keep material things in perspective. "And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work." II Cor. 9:8
- 3. It has eternal righteous consequences.
 "As it is written; 'He has dispersed abroad, He has given to the poor, His righteousness endures forever." II Corinthians 9:9
- 4. It brings God's blessing of multiplication into play.
 "Now may He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your righteousness." II Cor. 9:10
- 5. It supplies the needs of other of God's children.
 "For the administration of this service not only supplies the needs of the saint.."
 II Corinthians 9:12
- 6. It causes the recipients to give God thanks for supplying their need.
 "...but also is abounding through many thanksgiving to God." II Corinthians 9:12
- 8. It generate Christian love and prayers between believers. II Corinthians 9:14 "and by their prayer for you, who long for you because of the exceeding GRACE of God in you." II Corinthians 9:14

APPLICATION:

With all these examples, principles and promises, let us see that we cry out for this most gracious spirit of giving. "It is more blessed to give, than to receive."

Acts 20:35

"Give and it shall be given unto you, good measure, pressed down shaken together shall men give unto you."

GRACE AND BEAUTY

Sin results in various forms ugliness. Abel's battered body would be a harbinger of the repugnant carnage that would follow in time. Cain's altered countenance and malignant attitude still characterize our species. We have fallen and glory has been lost. Instinctively we desire and strive for beauty by some definition. God's chosen have longed to be restored to the intended beauty His created us for. God also wills it to be done.

Since the word 'grace' means to be favored, endowed, or gifted, then it stands to reason that upon whom grace was imparted there would be an admirable spiritual qualities. In the natural sense the term is used to describe someone's extraordinary demeanor or skill. Jesus was known for His grace in words and in deeds. The Christian life in every facet is beautiful to behold.

BY GOD'S GRACE, LET'S BE BEAUTIFUL

GRACE AND STRENGTH

"You therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus." II Timothy 2:1

The name of God 'Elohim' designates Him as the 'Strong One' or the very source and epitome of strength. Power belongs to Him and it is His to give. Therefore His grace has a strengthening factor. Strength by definition means; 'power to resist or endure, power to act in a desired manner physically, spiritually, or mentally.' There is a mutual admiration and desire for strength in its many forms. Our heroes are those who demonstrate strength and steadfastness in the time of difficulty. Jesus is the greatest of all examples. He demonstrated grace in human form. He was the 'Strong One.'

Strengthening grace began to unfold in the Old Testament era,. but it was partial and imperfect. Moments of great exploits were contrasted with gross weaknesses among God's people. Abraham believed God against great odds, but couldn't tell the truth about his wife Sarah. Samson could defeat an army single handed but couldn't resist a woman's arms. Solomon could give great advice to youth but couldn't live up to it himself. Mercy presided until perfect grace could come through Jesus.

"For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly." Romans 5:6

"And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us."

Hebrews 11:39,40

The grace of Jesus empowers believers to virtuous character and acceptable service to God. This is imparted by the Holy Spirit which is given as a result of Jesus' victorious life over the world, the flesh, and the devil.

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right (power) to become children of God, to those who believe in His name." John 1:12

"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Acts 1:8

Grace is granted to individuals that it may be compounded in community. At the very base of community is marriage. This primary institution was the vehicle by which man/woman shared paradise and dominion as equals.

So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. 28 Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." 29 And God said, "See, I have given you every herb that yields seed which is on the face of all the earth, and every tree whose fruit yields seed; to you it shall be for food. Genesis 1:27-29

It is only for us to try to contemplate what how glorious it must have been for Adam and Eve to share the wonders of a pure creation together. They moved about in unashamed nakedness even in the presence of God. That was before temptation and choice came into play. Together they lived a life of innocence, together they fell from it. Consequently marriage has become the uneasy sharing of tempered joys and heartbreaking sorrows. The long road back is called Redeeming Grace. The grace (favor) of Jesus Christ gives a new focus for intimacy. The prototype of this restoration is Christ and His church.

"For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones. 31 "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." 32 This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church. 33 Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband." Ephesians 5:30-33

The godly husband and wife are effectual in their God given roles. Love and respect become the watch words for redeeming their relationship. No one is in better position to truly be a blessing to another than a man or woman to their spouse. Christianity begins at home. Grace is exemplified and magnified there. There Christ would set up the likeness of His throne that would extend to a larger community. The home is essential to the kingdom of God.

The chaste conduct of a godly wife is not only a boon to a believing husband, but could very well be the means of salvation for an unbelieving one. Her beauty should not be a matter of clothes and jewelry, but flow from a restful spirit. As her husband should seek to be a son of Abraham by emulating his faith, she should identify with Sarah as her example of a godly wife.

"Wives, likewise, be submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word, they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives, 2 when they observe your chaste conduct accompanied by fear. 3 Do not let your adornment be merely outward — arranging the hair, wearing gold, or putting on fine apparel — 4 rather let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God. 5 For in this manner, in former times, the holy women who trusted in God also adorned themselves, being submissive to their own husbands, 6 as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord, whose daughters you are if you do good and are not afraid with any terror."

1 Peter 3:1-6

The husband is admonished to take a stewardship position with his wife to love, honor, and to keep her. He must understand her basic constitution that she is weaker physically and emotionally than he. Therefore he should, in intimacy, provide the protection and assurance that she needs. When each assume and operate in their roles, together they bring a grace upon them with unlimited potential for good. They become heirs together of the good things God has in store for them that love Him. Their united prayers are an effectual force. This is the oneness God intended not only for a man and wife, but for the entire body of believers.

"Husbands, likewise, dwell with them with understanding, giving honor to the wife, as to the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life, that your prayers may not be hindered."
