As he grew older, Bob got involved with boat racing. During the interview, he reminisced about his 1954 Hal Kelly Airborne Runabout (pictured above).





Tim Olson


Tim Olson of Grantsburg, WI passed away on February 15, 2017 at the age of 74 after being hospitalized for poor health.

Christopher "Kit" Owen of Superior, WI passed away on February 16, 2017 at the age of 68.


