CHILLICOTHE, Oh— Motocross in Ohio is making a comeback from its heyday back in the 80's. Why? people like Scott Plessinger, Jeremy Osborne and Jason Rodgers, race promoters from north and south Ohio, are the reason.

Over the years, Ohio has had numerous racing organizations and promoters. Tracks come and go. Some AMA sanctioned, others affiliated with other sanctioning bodies, and some just dusty, tire lined courses in a beanfield. AMA Districts 11 & 12, and the CRA, are just a few of the entities that have held motocross races within the Buckeye State over the years. Traditionally, Ohio has had a strong interest in the sport with motocross tracks, both public and private, littering the state from end to end.

Two new organizations have emerged and are taking Ohio by storm. Race Ohio MX, the southern organization operated by Scott Plessinger, and the OMA in the north, operated by Jeremy Osborne. These groups have been growing each year since they began.

ANAHEIM, CA— The excitement and the wait is over. A1 took place Saturday, January 4th. I know many of local riders have been waiting on this to get started. No one could be more excited than Scott Plessinger.

Aaron Plessinger, Scott's son and our local connection to the big show, would be back on the bike after suffering a season ending Supercross injury last year at Daytona.

The injury required surgery on his right ankle/heel. The surgery went well but the healing part was another story. Aaron was able to come back and compete at Ironman, but on the day of the race, he was sick.

Aaron was in the first 450 qualifier and was fast coming out of the gate. In the first turn, a rider went down and riders started maneuvering to get around, creating a pile up.

As Aaron attempted to take the inside to avoid the pile up, it appeared another rider clipped his front tire, causing AP to go down. Another rider came into the mix and rode up on AP's left ankle.

Visions of 2019 had to be rushing back into his mind while getting to his bike. AP was unable to finish the qualifying round, which meant if he was able to continue, he would have to finish in the top 4 of the LCQ (Last Chance Qualifier) to make the main event.

I messaged someone close to the organization about his ability to make it back in the LCQ. They said his ankle was very sore. So most us had to wait on whether he could return or not.

The LCQ gate was set and there was AP7 on the line. AP was 4th most of the moto until the last lap. AP bobbled in the whoops and was passed, putting him outside the top 4. AP continued to battle and made the pass right before the final turn at the finish line.

The final field of riders for the 450 main event was set. AP7 was in. With a very painful ankle, AP would have to sit and ice it prior to the main. Having overcome some adversity in the first qualifier and the LCQ, it would be hard to gauge how he might do in the main. I'm sure his emotions were all over the place while sitting in his trailer icing his ankle.

AP got a good start during the main event and sat in the top 10 for most of the race. He was as high as eighth place at one time. AP lost a couple positions to finish the race in 12th place.

AP had to overcome so much adversity on this night, I know 12th is not what he was hoping for, but I'm sure he will take that and start preparing for St. Louis.






The Dome at America Center, St. Louis, Mo.
