Trying to Feed the Masses

Once a month, Bethany Place receives 30-35 food boxes from Hickory Flat Church of God delivered by David Cain, one of the many faithful supporters that help to keep our food pantry stocked. Our pantry feeds not only the families that reside within Bethany Place, but also serves as an emergency food pantry for the surrounding community. People refer families to Bethany Place and we are able to give out several boxes of food at a time. Our desire is to one day be a Food Bank that serves Cherokee County. Walk in freezers were donated by one of our supporters and are in the process of being up and running. Food donations are always welcomed. PROJECTS & REPAIRS

Bethany Place is in dyer need of help picking up food donations for the Ministry. We have consistent food pick-ups and right now have two volunteers who help whenever they are able to. However, We are in need of someone who can be available (possibly with a truck!) to assist us when we have added food pick-ups or occasionally furniture pick-ups.

As always, Bethany Place is in need of volunteers to help with different projects and repairs throughout the facility. Without consistent help, the staff at Bethany Place is comprised of 3 people who do not have much experience with handiwork. Bethany Place has construction, electrical, plumbing, lawn maintenance and many other needs on a regular basis. 


a word from the director
