
# WILLIAMSBURG WRESTLING CLUB NEWS LETTER

## GUERRILLA INDIVIDUAL OPEN AND ROOKIE TOURNAMENT

Williamsburg Wrestling Club finished 7<sup>th</sup> out of 34 clubs who entered wrestlers. We placed 21 of 27 kids in the top 4 and had 5 tournament individual champions. Christian Gordy, Ethan Pope, Dean France, Adam Ayala and John Engbersen all won golds for the Outlaws in their respective weight groups. Ethan pope won the team award for the K-2 group for most outstanding wrestler as he won by fall over last year's VAWA state Champion. 3-5 Team award winner went to Harold Dahl who finished third and going 3-2 on the day and losing close tough matches in his defeats. For the 6-8<sup>th</sup> grade group, Adam Ayala won the award after going 4-0 and winning all 4 matches by fall and scoring 24 team points.
