

JCHS Museum of Art + History Open and Free on Saturday, May 3, from 11:00 AM – 7:00 PM

540 Water Street, Port Townsend

Housed within the historic 1892 City Hall building in downtown Port Townsend, the Museum of Art + History highlights the region's history and showcases local artists and curators with long-term and rotating exhibitions. Currently on display in the Ferguson Gallery, Jamestown S'Klallam artist Timothy O'Connell III presents *yíy'ya? cn ?i? ?u?k^wtnít cn nəs?á?ta?* (*I Was Far Away But Now I'm Here*), a body of work exploring Indigenous identity, movement, and homecoming. In the Wilson Gallery artist Meg Kaczyk shares an intimate and deeply moving portrayal of caregiving through her exhibition *Notes from Next to the Bed: A Caregiving Love Story in Words & Pictures*.

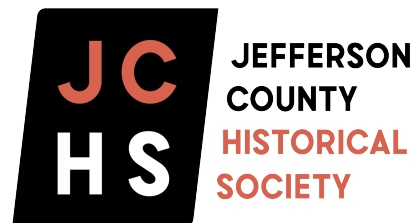
Victorian Festival attendees will receive a 10% discount at our museum gift shop during the festival with proof of ticket.
