

Historic Rothschild House Open and Free

Friday, May 2, from 11:00 AM – 4:00 PM

418 Taylor Street, Uptown Port Townsend

Open seasonally in partnership with Washington State Parks, the 1868 Rothschild House offers a unique experience that transports visitors to late 19th- and early 20th-century Port Townsend. Unlike many historic houses that carefully curate and stage non-original items to recreate the past, the Rothschild House stands out as an authentic time capsule, preserving the original furnishings, belongings, and atmosphere of a bygone era.

Accessibility

House interior is two levels that are only accessible by stairs. Grounds are all at street level.

Parking & Restrooms

Limited free parking is available onsite. There are no restrooms at the Rothschild House; please plan accordingly. Uptown streets may be congested during Saturday farmers markets, festivals, and parades.
