Objections

The Truth About Jesus' Desire to Redeem

- The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact expression of His nature, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After making purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Heb 1.3).
- But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because He suffered death, so that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone. In bringing many sons to glory, it was fitting for God, for whom and through whom all things exist, to make the author of their salvation perfect through suffering" (Heb 2.9-10).
- "For the joy that lay before Him, He endured the cross, despising the shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12.2).
