

TGS Patch Happenings

Bay Area Gourd Patch

During March, C.C. Rice taught the Bay Area Patch how to create a basket pattern on a gourd. We made a flat reed pattern and discussed how to carve a coiled basket and what burrs were needed for that effect.

In April, Karen Knight taught us a variety of techniques for applying colored pencil to gourds. She talked about the different substrates that can be used and the differences in them. She talked about all the different types of colored pencils there are and let us experiment with some new ones that she had just purchased. She also discussed color blending, the different products used, and ways to blend. It was a very informative class with lots of information.

C.C. Rice was selected as a special exhibitor at the 2017 Texas City Art Show. Eighteen gourds were on exhibit during April at the Doyle Convention Center. Each gourd demonstrated a different technique and finish.

We have been working on learning several techniques – working with alcohol dyes and how it reacts on the gourds (really neat, I must say), each gourd was so different! We met again to cut, clean our gourds, drill holes in them to learn how to coil pine needles.

Our next meeting one of our members will be showing us how to use doss clay to make gourd masks.

Dallas Gourd Patch

The Dallas Gourd Patch has been experiencing a surge in attendance and membership. We are thrilled to contribute to the growth of fine gourd art!

In April we completed month three of a three part demo and workshop. We learned the how to's of all kinds of clay, and then learned how to sculpt on a

gourd with clays. Once sculpted we had a painting workshop and completed our projects.

Gears changed in May as we were so fortunate to have Cheryl Darrow from Ten Seconds Studio give us an informative demo on patina paints. She was so entertaining, funny and full of ways to use this messy and fun paint. She graciously furnished the paints and patinas so that we could play. Can't wait to see everyone's results in our June meeting!

Becky Truex gave us a demo/workshop in June on how to use vinyl resist sheet/patterns. This is a fun and easy gourd product and gives a beautiful finished gourd. If you haven't tried it Becky has vinyl sheets for sale.

Dee Reichert has come up with a new finish that looks like rock or stone. We are going to spend the day learning and playing with this technique in July.

Everyone is preparing and working hard on competition gourds for the Texas State Festival in August and the Texas State Fair in October. The State Fair handbook is out so get those registration forms mailed in July! Or go to BigTex.com and sign up. The Fair has graciously given us 9 competition classes this year. Let's show them what gourd art really is! And we have been invited back to do a day long demo during the fair.

We are also working on Halloween gourds to be donated to the Dallas Arboretum for their kindness in letting us come to the garden in early December to collect their discarded gourds.

It's been a busy year and we are having fun and learning so much!

Guadalupe Gourd Patch

The Guadalupe Gourd Patch has been very busy this year meeting on the second Saturday of every month. Our membership has grown to 23 active members and a large number attend each month. The theme each month has been dedicated to learning new techniques as opposed to finishing a gourd project, and enjoying a fine covered dish lunch provided by members of the patch.



In April, the class was dedicated to learning new coiling techniques using pine needles where we incorporated a pine needle knot as a part of the coil. The technique appeared on two gourds entered in the KACC Fine Art Gourd Show currently showing in Kerrville. One of those gourds by Judy Richie won an Honorable Mention.

In May the patch learned several techniques in making a southwest theme gourd. The varied options included pottery shards, American Indian

symbols, southwest scenes, cutouts and carving on the gourd.

The June meeting was a class taught by Becky Klix on the application of gold leaf to a gourd. Becky has shown she knows what she is doing by winning the VIP award at last years Lone Star Gourd Show with her entry. A picture of the gourd helmet can be found on the Lone Star website. Every member created a beautiful gold leaf design.

We had five members of the patch enter the KACC Fine Art Gourd Show with three Honorable Mention ribbons going to Judy Richie and a Second Place ribbon in the Southwest Division to David Cleaveland. Others entering fine art gourds from our patch included Becky Klix, Sharon Harrison and Betty Vertin. Every member who entered sold at least one gourd. If you did not see the show or enter gourds of your own, you need to make it a must see or do next year. The show runs through June 25.

Hill Country Gourd Patch



We are mightily charging along in the formation of our new gourd patch. In April we were so very excited to learn pine needle coiling from Dee Reichert. Dee showed a bunch of beginners the best of her patience. Thanks to Dee for coming to us in the Hill Country.

In May, Mari Tarver "dropped in" to teach us beading and some stain techniques. Unfortunately, she kept us so busy, we forgot to take pictures!



We were all proud to find out that Don Sharp was the Featured Artist of the Month at Buchanan Arts and Crafts Gallery.

In June we voted it "too hot to learn anything," and worked on our own projects. We had so much fun, we almost didn't go home...

Bonnie is an incredibly talented artist and sought-after teacher whose career spans nearly 40 years. She has a deep appreciation of the native cultures of the American Southwest. She is represented in several fine art galleries and has won multiple awards. Bonnie's art is inspired by her love of nature and the Southwest.

This piece, Hiding Out In Plain Sight, is relief carved and painted. It is approximately 11 inches tall \times 9 inches diameter with a retail value of \$1,000.

It is hard to fully appreciate the level of detail and the nature of the art from a photo – even a very good one.

The gourd will be on display at the Lone Star Festival in the Ways & Means booth.

Lone Star Festival Competition

It's time to check out the 2016 competition guidelines, categories and divisions and start designing and creating those super entry pieces! All the information is posted on the Texas Gourd Society website.

The competition area is one of the most interesting areas of the festival for first timers as it is for the membership. We're really hoping for a record number of entries this year!

The artisan of the Best of Show entry becomes the Artist of the Year and receives a free booth in the following year's festival. Just think it could be you!

Members of the Southeast Patch are organizing the competition area this year. Our committee has come with a new line up of categories, the divisions are the same.

This year we have a new exciting open theme category, TEXAS OUR TEXAS. One entry allowed per person, multiple artisans or a partnership. This way you can work on your own piece, one with friends, grandchildren, patch members, family members, invite a non-gourd person to help you! This is open from youth levels to masters. Entries in this special theme open division will not be able to be considered for Best of Show due to the rules. The entries must focus on a theme that is representative of Texas. Think of Texas heritage, animal life, terrain, history cultures, art, music, people, etc., any technique or mediums are allowed.

You can enter this category plus your entries from any other arts and craft division and or the growers division. When considering entry fees, at least one person from the multiple or partnership needs to be a TGS member to receive the lower member's entry fee, this person should fill out the entry form.

The Texas Our Texas entries will be setup on a special display table area and we have some nice ribbons of Texas size for the 1st place through 3rd place. We're hoping for lots of entries to show Texas gourd art at its best!
