We will list those who have purchased ads in the Gourdzette on the website. We would also like to list craft shows that TGS members will participate in and galleries and art centers where members show. CC will need members to email this info so she can add it to the website.

Now it is time to think about what else TGS will do in 2015. We have the dates set for the "Lone Star Gourd Festival". It will be held on July 29, 2015 through August 2, 2015 which makes it 5 days long. It will be held at the same place as last year, The New Braunfels Convention Center, in New Braunfels, Texas. Since the show is longer this year, it will allow us to have more classes. Wednesday morning will be used to mark out booth spaces followed by booth setup for some. Wednesday afternoon and all day Thursday will be for classes only which will allow vendors to take some classes and not be worried about someone taking care of their booth. Friday, Saturday and Sunday will have classes and the "Gourd Festival". The application for teachers is in this issue of "The Gourdzette" and should be on the website soon.

We also could use more vendors for the 2015 show. The application should be on the website or soon will be. So if you know anyone who sells supplies that can be used on gourds or who sell decorated gourds, give them the website to get an application. Remember, items sold at the show must be gourd related in some form.

And we need more entries in the competition area. Whether this is the first time to enter or the 20th time, we want the public to see what we can do with a gourd.

We had such a good show last year. But we can do better. I am planning on having a food vendor for lunch so we do not have to leave to go eat. CC is trying to expand publicity to reach more people. If you have a suggestion for a magazine or newspaper to advertise in, email CC the info.

A date has not been set for the Spring meeting yet. I will send an email and put it on the website as soon as a decision is made.

Please take pictures at Patch meetings and write articles to send to Rickie to put in the Gourdzette. Send instructions on anything related to gourds. Send youtube videos related to gourds. New ideas or old ideas welcomed. Members new to gourds always welcome info even if it is old news to some members. Or if you come up with an easier way to do something with a gourd, let everyone know by sending it to Rickie.

And a big welcome to the 2015 Board. I am looking forward to working with you and hope to make TGS 2015 the best year yet.

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

The Texas Gourd Society (TGS) thanks you for applying to teach at the Lone Star Gourd Festival. The TGS Board is excited to bring the 2015 Lone Star Gourd Festival back to New Braunfels, Texas from July 29th thru August 2nd. Centrally located in New Braunfels, the Civic Center provides outdoor and indoor spaces to host our festival classes. Vendors and the competition area are indoors with air conditioning. Our new location has drawn more visitors to the festival to promote interest in and appreciation of gourds, your classes and our vendors. Classes without carving and pyrography will be held indoors and there will be a separate covered outdoor space for all carving and pyrography. Please include any materials fees in the cost of your class. There is also a \$10 fee to TGS for each student that is to be included in the class price.

Deadline for applications is a firm date of March 15, 2015. You will be notified by April 1, 2015 if your class is accepted. We will be looking for a diverse set of classes, some that are unique and/or new, and great teachers.

Email a photo for your class to Vickie Echols at vickiesvessels@ymail.com . The photo for your class is what will represent your class and work, and what will "sell" your class. Try to submit a great picture of the class project. Your photos will not be touched up or changed, and will be used for the "Classes" page on our website.

All classes will be posted to our website http://www.texasgourdsociety.org/ Classes.html by June 1st, 2015. Classes will also be highlighted in the TGS Gourdzette newsletter and our Facebook page.

The cutoff time for a class to meet the minimum of 5 students is July 15, 2015. This is a firm deadline. At that time, if the minimum of 5 students is not met, it will be up to the teacher to cancel the class or not.

TGS has considered 5 students as a low minimum for each class, as we do have many drop-ins at showtime. If your class meets the minimum (5) you will be expected to teach that class.

Inlay & Carving Without Sanding

Barbie Holton



All Skill Levels Outside Class 4-hour Class

This class combines two exciting techniquesinlay and carving. Students will learn the basics of both, but creative options will be available for the experienced. Cutting crisp lines, textured carving and stone inlay - all without sanding. A choice of designs will be available.

The Berry Bowl Sue Haberer



All Skill Levels Outside 4-hour Class

You will use a Philodendron sheath along the top of your gourd and pinecones and berries as embellishments. You will use acrylic paints to add color to your gourd after drilling a few filigree holes along the top. Everything will be provided to complete this project, except carver/drill and bit.

Teacher Supply List:

Gourd, pencil, stone inlay material, CA glue and accelerator, spoons, dye, and handouts. **Supply cost \$10**

Student Supply List:

Dust mask
Rotary carving tool
Burrs to include inverted cone and ball (burrs can be purchased at class, if necessary)

Teacher Supply List:

Philodendron leaf, Needle /sinew, Embellishments, Glue and paint. **Supply Cost \$10**

Paints if you prefer a different color Drill or carver Scissors Filigree drill bit Gloves for paint Extension cord and power strip Dust Mask

Metallic Painted Carved Dragonfly

Shelia Guidry



All Skill Levels Inside 4-hour Class

Dragonfly will be relief carved and background around gourd will be filigree carved on part and stipple carved on part. Then we will paint the dragonfly, dye the gourd, and glue on the leafing. Dragonfly body will be carved and inlayed with glass frit.

Teacher Supply List:

Gourd, paint, dye, sealer, leafing and glue, glass frit and rhinestones for eyes of dragonfly. **Supply Cost \$25**

Student Supply List:

Rotary carver(any brand but if using a dremel, the flex shaft is highly recommended so you are not holding the heavy carver, just the light hand piece on the shaft) with carving bits. I use double cut carbide bits in 2 sizes and will have more info where to buy them soon. Bonnie Gibson sells the bits to do the filigree carving and I have 6 of them I can loan.

Relief Carved Magnolia

Sheila Guidry



All Skill Levels Outside 8-hour Class

Relief carved magnolia with carved background around magnolia. Magnolia will be painted with acrylic paint. We will also put gold leafing around border of magnolia and the rest of the gourd will be dyed using Transtint alcohol dye.

Carving will be done in the morning. In the afternoon we will finish what carving is left, then paint magnolia, dye gourd, put on gold leaf and spray seal it. I will have inside of gourd already painted for everyone.

Teacher Supply List:

Gourd, paints, paint brushes, dyes, spray sealer, gold leafing and glue. **Supply Cost \$25**

Student Supply List:

Rotary carver and bits to carve

I use Double Cut Carbide Burrs because they cut smoother and need less sanding. I like a flame or tree shape and use 1/8 inch shaft and 3/32 shaft. I will have more info on where to buy them soon. A small round bit is also needed to do the background. A woodburner with a skew pen will be used to outline the magnolia first. If you do not have one, you can use mine.

Intermediate and Advanced Levels Outside 8-hour class

Come spend the day with master instructor Sue Haberer and learn 6 techniques in one day. You will be given a gourd with a predrawn pattern ready for you to practice basic carving skills. Filagree carving will be added to the sides of your gourd. A Fleur de Lis will be wood-burned on the front with stippling as a background. Using my sponge technique, you will paint the body of your gourd. Finishing up, you will learn to lay gold leaf to accentuate the Fleur de lis as well as add a Philodendron leaf as an embellishment.

Teacher Supply list:

Gourd, Gold leaf, Adhesive, Philodendron leaf and sinew/ needles. Sponges and paints Finishing spray.

Student Supply list:

Dremel like carver of your choice

Bits: various size balls, cutting wheel, inverted cone,

How often have you wanted to know what is the difference between brands of alcohol dyes or the difference between acrylic paint and transparent acrylic paint? What is the difference between spray sealers and brush on water-based sealers? We will discuss what dyes, inks, and acrylic paints are. I will have 3 brands of alcohol dyes, 5 or 6 types of acrylic paints, alcohol-based leather dye, water-based leather dye, fabric dye, many types of spray sealers, and whatever else I can find.

Teacher Supply List: Everything but gourds. Supply Cost \$5

Student Supply List: Bring gourds you wish to dye.



I will demo each. Then you will be able to use them to dye gourds. We should have time to dye 2 or 3 gourds. I will have transtint alcohol dye and Memories ink dye for sale.

All Skill Levels **Outside Class 4**hour Class

Join instructor Sue Haberer in this fun and therapeutic class. You will learn the simple process of designing your own luminary lamp. Instructions will be given on where to buy the perfect gourds and lamp kits. Using templates of your choice, designs will be drawn on the gourds. No two gourds will be alike as all designs are subject to your own

Gourds and lamp kits will be provided.

Teacher Supply List: Gourd and Lamp kit. Supply cost \$15
