

PLANTING A GOURD IN A CONTAINER - PART TWO

In the last Gourdzette Gourdipedia I featured an article on how to plant a gourd in a container. I have done this the last few years and had great results. In fact in the 2012 TGS Festival, I won a second place ribbon for 3 of a kind green gourd. Unfortunately I have to report that because of the drought we had this year in Texas, a lengthy vacation, and a failure to water by my house sitters my container gourd did not make it. However, last year I tried water rotting my green gourds and threw out the seeds in a small (6' X 8') grassy area and this year had volunteers come up. And wow did they produce. So I guess the moral of the story is never count your gourds before they bloom and never underestimate the power of **VOLUNTEERISM**.





KID'S KORNER

GERRY FLEWHARTY Contributing Editor:

TURKEY BIRDHOUSE CENTERPIECE

MATERIALS NEEDED: 1 Bottle gourd, approximately 10-inches tall with a flat bottom Acrylic paint - red, white, black, brown Paint brush – 1/2-inch flat Small dish with water Sanford Sharpie permanent black marking pen Raffia – 20 strands (can use mixed colors) Glue - wood, carpenters or super Pencil Masking tape String – about 8-inches long Hand saw, X-acto or jigsaw Polyurethane or varnish (apply with brush or spray)

INSTRUCTIONS:

*Select a clean dried gourd. Use a pencil and draw a circle about 1-inch in diameter for the entry into the birdhouse. Draw eyes, wattle (below eyes), apples, gourds, and feathers on each side of the turkey. Cut out the circle using a saw. Ask an adult to supervise the cutting. Mark a triangle-shape on the cut piece of wood (leftover from circle) to form a beak. Cut. Glue beak below the eyes.

*Clean inside of birdhouse using an old spoon with a long handle to remove seeds and pulp. Save the seeds to plant next spring to grow your own gourds. Avoid breathing the dust and mold inside the gourd.

*Outline the pencil lines for designs and turkey face with the black permanent marking pen. Paint the apples red, apple stems brown, eyebrows black, eyes white, beak yellow, stem red and wattle red. Clean brush in water after using. Dry. Add a second coat of paint to these areas. Dry. Add a black dot in the center of each eye and white dot designs on the apples. Dry. Write "give thanks" in pencil and outline letters with permanent marking pen. Make letters bold so they can be easily read.

*Cut 20 strands of raffia 19-inches long. Make a loop by holding two ends together. Hold 10 loop strands together and wrap with masking tape about 2-inches above the cut ends. Make four bundles (10 strands each). Tie bundles together with string. Glue the tied bundles on the back of the turkey (approximately 3-inches above the bottom of the gourd) to form the tail.

*Seal with polyurethane or varnish to preserve. Use as a Thanksgiving centerpiece or as a birdhouse after Thanksgiving. -Enjoy!-


