The purpose of the show is to allow artists to display, compete and sell their work in an exhibit of the highest quality gourd artwork in a formal gallery venue and to promote and encourage public appreciation of gourd art. The gallery is now accepting applications for entries to this juried event, with applications accepted through January 15, 2012. 




A Loving Tribute
