#### **Gourd Castle**

If you are traveling in New Mexico and are in the Bloomfield area, in the far northwest corner on U.S. 64, stop by the Salmon Ruins (6131 Highway 64, Bloomfield, 505-632-2013) and see the exhibit by artist Douglas G. Miller, "Seven Wonders", featuring *Perseverance Castle*, a sculpture of gourds and glue. The castle measures 17 ½" tall x 10" diameter x 31 ½" around. This is Mr. Miller's first sculpture with gourds. The castle is constructed of thousands of gourd shard pieces, hand carved individually to build and furnish the castle. He meticulously fashioned each piece of the intricate floor and castle with the pieces. Looking closely, the viewer can see stairwells, furnishings, and other minute details through windows and doorways of the structure. This sculpture won First Place at the National Gourd Society Juried Art Competition in 2006. This castle was featured in a recent edition of the American Gourd Society's <u>The Gourd</u> magazine. Mr. Miller sent a special invitation to all members of the Texas Gourd Society to view the exhibit, which runs March 15, 2007 through June 2008. Thanks to Joe Pritchard for this information

#### FALL FESTIVAL COMPETITION

The Competition Committee for the 2007 Lone Star Gourd Festival is happy to report that it has completed its task of revamping the show guidelines. Some categories have been deleted and new categories have been added. Plus, we're really excited to announce a new Division!

First, seven new categories have been added to the Open Division. They are: Land Animals, Air Animals, Sea Animals, Botanical World, Southwest Inspired, Celtic Inspired and Multiple Artisans or Partnership. Also, this year our Texas themed category is 'Texas Our Texas'. TGS artists will be asked to create a piece of Texas style art as a tribute to this great state.

Next, the new Division that has been added is Fine Art. Anyone may enter, however, all entries must be the original work of the artist (no patterns or copies of other artists work) and if an artist enters this Division they may not enter the same class in the Open Division i.e. Fine Art-Mixed Media and Open Division-Mixed Media. The new classes comprising this division are Mixed Media, Sculpture and Southwest/Western Theme.

Additionally, some of the rules have been modified. This year, entrants will be allowed to place their business card or other small card beside their entry (after judging) with information about their location at the show (booth number) or contact information (phone number, address or website) for selling purposes. However, NO SALES PRICING will be allowed on these cards.

These modifications have been made with the intention of improving our Festival competition. It is our hope that these changes will inspire more of our members to submit their work and will foster a greater appreciation of the talent our members possess when viewed by the public that attends this event.

Darla Hines, Committee Chair, has done an excellent job heading this committee. Her hard work and dedication is such a great asset to this society. Members like Darla are what make our organization great. Thank you Darla and all of the Competition Committee – Bill Broughton, Sylvia Gaines, Dusti Lockey, Hellen Martin, Judy Richie, and Patty Sorensen for your contribution to the 2007 Lone Star Gourd Festival.



#### Don Vyskocil – TGS Artist of the Year

Don won all of the top TGS awards in Waco last fall best of show, people's choice and best of class. Don was born and raised in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. He went to school at University of Iowa and joined the Navy for three years before going back to complete a degree in Sociology. After graduating, he went to Chicago and later worked in retail clothing sales in Denver, and then in Colorado Springs where he met his first wife. Next, he went back to Cedar Rapids and was employed by the Boy Scouts. He transferred to Brenham with the Scouts, and then to Dallas, San Antonio, and back to Houston where he is Territory Manager of the Houston Scout Shops. He and his wife Susan live in Houston. Don has two sons and two grandchildren. His hobbies are fishing and art. As a teen, he got interested in cartoons at Disneyland, and in the Navy got more involved in art, concentrating on driftwood carving. About four years ago, a friend introduced Don to gourd art by Robert Rivera and got hooked on gourds, finding them much easier to work than wood. His art has been wildlife - mostly fish. A couple of courses he took many years ago probably influenced his interest. The courses were in "museum habitat". Don has entered TGS competition for the past three years - often using air dried clay with the gourd to get the effects he wanted. He is now planning more power carving to make his figures stand out. #### **Supplies:**

A gourd tile, cleaned and sanded. Acrylic paint of different colors Brushes Stylus (variety of sizes) Container with water Plastic plate (paint palette) Paper towels Hair Dryer

This class was taught by Abby Sandlin at our May 2007 meeting. Abby took a class by Gerry Flewharty in Waco last fall.



- 1. Paint the gourd tile with selected color using a large flat brush. Two coats will do.
- 2. Let it dry, you can use the hair dryer to hasten the process.
- 3. Transfer an easy pattern onto your gourd. Dot painting is done using the end of the brush (yes, the *other* end), or the tip of a stylus. Put a very small amount of paint on the palette and dip the tip of the stylus.
- 4. The paint is used as-is, not thinned, otherwise the design might bleed
- 5. Form a dot on the gourd. Follow the lines of your design, and fill-in later.
- 6. Always dip the brush in paint after each dot to insure better consistency in your dots.
- 7. Do not crowd the dots, otherwise the design will not show.
- 8. Play with stylus sizes to create a textural effect.


